COUNCIL REPORT

March 2020

Hello from Billinghay Parish Council

It's been a couple of busy months at the office as the financial year draws to an end and planning for 2020 – 2021 comes into being. Considerable time has been spent working on budgets and calculating the precept with its ongoing effect on Council Tax. It seems likely that both LCC and NKDC will be seeking an increase not to mention the police.

This year the Parish Council have had to take the following factors into consideration:

- There will be no payment from NKDC for the Office acting as a Local Access Point for NKDC. Even so we anticipate that there will still be many residents who expect this service and we will do what we can.
- LCC and NKDC have passed on the grass cutting of verges etc. that they currently complete. Although we will receive a fixed payment for this, it does not cover the cost of a contractor. Still, the cutting will probably be done more regularly.
- So that work in the office can be done more quickly, an additional member of staff is being recruited. This will enable the Office to be open to the public more frequently.
- The cost of maintenance continues to rise and needs factoring into the budget.

Consequently, the Parish portion of the Council Tax will increase by £3.25 per year for the average house.

On 22 January, members of the Emergency Planning teams in Lincoln and NKDC presented training to councillors, volunteers and local businesses, on dealing with "the golden hour" in an emergency situation in the village. A buffet lunch, provided by The Ship, was enjoyed, and lots of advice was shared for Billinghay's own Community Emergency Plan. If you feel that



you could offer support in the event of a disaster / major emergency in the village, please get in touch with the parish office, without any obligation. The next training planned will be on managing the rest centre.

New volunteers for the community speed watch scheme have been trained and are ready to help reduce the incidences of speeding throughout our village.

Sadly, the proposed community venue for the playing fields is unable to go ahead, due to planning restrictions making the ideas unfeasible. However, the Parish Council will be supporting the village hall in its plans for an extension.

A member of NK Community

Sport and Health Team gave a presentation at the January meeting and advised of opportunities to work with the parish council and the swimming pool to bring activities to the village. Questions were asked about the possibility of park runs for adults and children at the playing fields, but the field is not large enough.

Phil Orme continues to provide his security and enforcement services in the village and has given advice, and cautions, where required.

North Kesteven District Council has advised that it will no longer be cutting the grass verges they usually maintain therefore arrangements for this will now be undertaken by the parish council.

Please note the 18 May 2020 in your diaries. This is the Annual Parish Meeting, hosted by the chairman of the council, and is your opportunity to have your say about your village, meet your neighbours and enjoy a buffet supper. If you have a business or run a village group please do get in touch about having a free information stand at the event. There are still vacancies for parish councillors, so if you would like to represent your village, and make Billinghay the best it can be, then please do get in touch for further information.

Please remember that a parish council is the grass root level of government, and councillors are volunteers who work hard to represent their electorate, manage community facilities, and promote community activities, so please let us know of any issues or concerns or tell us what you would like to see in the village.

BILLINGHAY CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL

Welcome! We are now well into Term 3 and nearly half way through another academic year at school. Between now and Easter the children in Years 3/4 have their residential visit to Rand Farm Park. We are all looking forward to this and hope for fine weather.

During a busy half term since Christmas and upcoming events:

- All classes have carried out work focusing on e Safety (to coincide with the national Safer Internet Day on the 11th February).
- Our School Council are looking at ways as to how the school can help to reduce the amount of plastic that is used in our lives and how we can help to save the oceans. They are focusing on single use plastics and are striving to reduce the use of single use plastics in school. They have carried out a survey of single use plastics in lunch boxes and are now launching a competition for children to design posters aimed at encouraging the whole school community to limit using single use plastics with the aim to encourage the use of plastic reusable boxes or beeswax in lunch boxes.
- As a whole school we took part in Children's Mental Health Week on the wb 3rd February to help support our children with their own mental health and well-being. The week focused on how our brain works, feelings, emotions, our best qualities and 'finding our brave'. School organised a number of workshops; understanding the human brain and how that impacts on our emotions and well-being, meditation, play therapy, positive relationships, car safety, cycle helmet safety and workshops from Supporting Minds which focused on your inner superhero.
- The Year 6 Hawk class visited The Collection in Lincoln as part of their History topic on Ancient Egypt.
- Our children have taken part in the following sports competitions since Christmas: gymnastics, water polo and goalball.
- We have the NSPCC coming into school on the 5th March to carry out their Speak Out Stay Safe assembly with KS1 and KS2 and then to lead a workshop with Y5/6 pupils.
- Week beginning 23rd March will be science week in school.
- Our Easter Service will be at St Michael's Church on the 31st March at 10am.

We look forward to continued success in the remainder of the spring term and the lead up to Easter.

KEEP CALM AND HANG UP!

Lincolnshire Police have received a number of reports in the North Kesteven region where people have been victim of scams or receiving unwanted/nuisance phone calls.

Scams come in many forms; uninvited contact is received by email, letter, and telephone or in person making false promises to con victims out of money. There are many of these sorts of scams but some of the most common are, unpaid bills, fake lotteries, fake purchases, deceptive prize draws, Courier Scams, computer virus, and romance scams.

The criminals attempt to trick people with flashy, official looking documents or websites, or convincing telephone sales patter, with the aim of persuading them to send a processing or administration fee, pay postal or insurance costs.

One of the most common methods in this area is for a fraudster to pose as your bank or the Police to assist in a Police investigation over the phone. They claim your bank account has been fraudulently accessed, and that in order to protect your account you must act quickly. They say the solution is for you to transfer your money to a so-called 'safe account'. But actually, this account is controlled by the fraudster. When you move the money, they steal it.

Some instances they suggest that you hang up and ring the Police/Bank back to ensure the call is genuine. – Don't be fooled – they stay on the line!

Some occasions they ask you to attend your bank/ post office and withdraw your money, even in euros and send cash through MoneyGram's.

Fraudsters often use a tactic called 'number spoofing', in order to make their call appear genuine. The number you see on your phone display matches that of your bank or local number. But in fact the fraudster has manipulated this number, by disabling the actual number they are calling from. Should you query who they are and if they are genuine, they ask you to check your handset display in an attempt to convince you it's a real call.

The fraudster, often claiming to come from some well-known computer company, will try to convince you that your computer has a virus, or that your internet connection is running slow. To 'fix' the problem the fraudster will ask you to allow them to take control of your computer in order to work on it. Once on your computer, they install software which steals your personal data. Also, if the fraudster asks you to access your online bank account for payment, they can see you enter all your login details.

Remember Police and banks will never ask you to withdraw money and send it to them.

Don't discuss money or your bank information over the phone!

Nuisance call blocking technology can be very effective if you want to protect yourself or your older members of your family from scam calls.

Steps to take:

- Keep calm and hang up.
- Don't give in to the pressure.
- Telephone your bank or the Police to give them the details.
- Report to Action fraud.

If you or you know of anyone who has been a recent victim of a scam please report this to Lincolnshire Police on 101.

We have received our usual contribution from our Skirth Road resident this month taking aim at unsolicited phone calls and emails.

Telephones and email and post that allow people to communicate with you are wonderful inventions if you want to hear from these people but not so good if you don't. Most of the phone calls I get nowadays are unwanted as they come from corporate bodies trying to relieve me of my money or waste my time on a survey. Any relief from these phone calls is welcome and on 29th August 2019 at one second to midnight I celebrated by opening a bottle of lemonade and cheering loudly as the final , final deadline for claiming a PPI rebate had passed (I think that there had been several earlier deadlines announced in an attempt by many groups to persuade people to get on with their applications but this was definitely the last time to claim the rebate) . So although I may still have to consider in future whether to renew a warranty on a Dyson vacuum cleaner that I have never owned or whether to claim compensation for an accident that I have not had and give serious thought to how to clear a virus on a computer that is working perfectly I would not have to worry about Payment Protection Insurance.

I can remember in the 1980s having taken out a credit card receiving my first statement that contained a item between £4 and £5 for something called Payment Protection insurance. On querying this it was apparent that I had not ticked a box saying that I did not want it and there was no way I could avoid paying it. I said that if that was the case I would pay it and cut up my credit card and return it to the provider. The PPI payment for that month and all future months were cancelled almost immediately. I then had no thoughts about PPI for many years until it became apparent for many years PPI had been mis-sold and huge sums of compensation were available. I was amazed at how poor my memory had become as I received frequent phone calls promising me considerable sums of money as PPI on loans that I had forgotten all about. There was one particular call when the caller said that he had obtained my records and on being guestioned assured me that in 2008 I had taken out a loan from Lloyds Bank for £5000 over 3 years and I was entitled to reclaim PPI. I said that I was surprised that I could not remember the loan and as it was now 2013 I was even more surprised that Lloyds Bank had not contacted me in the last 5 years to find out why none of the loan had been repaid. The caller terminated the call before I could ask how he was going to benefit from trying to claim a rebate on a loan that never existed.

Another phone call came on afternoon when a caller rang to say that I was entitled to £3200 PPI compensation. I said that I was delighted and asked for clarification as to if that was part of the £4300 I had been told about the same morning or if I actually had £7500 coming to me. Unfortunately the phone went dead and dialling 1471 had the effect of

informing me that they did not have the caller's number so I missed out on a lot of money.

As the final adverts came on TV warning of the final deadline I realised that I had booked to play a squash league game that evening. Although I try to do things in good time I am aware that many people leave things to the last minute. I considered ringing my opponent to check if he had heard of the deadline to avoid being let down on that evening as he filled in his PPI forms. I decided against as I would probably not win anyway and if he did not turn up I would claim the points. On arriving at the club I found my opponent there along with many other players in a packed changing room. I was amazed. I thought everybody would be at home filling in PPI forms on-line. I have no idea if they had forgotten or if they were organised to have done it in good time.

I hope that all of the many people who were hoodwinked and misled and genuinely entitled to compensation have received their compensation by sending their application in themselves and avoided paying 30% of it to some helpful telephone caller. PPI mis-selling is no more but there is bound to be another scam along soon.

We have also been asked to print a note of thanks from Mrs Hagger of Brunswick Square.

Sometime in October last year, she lost her purse on Walcott Road and despite searching was unable to locate it.. She would like to thank the gentleman who found and returned the purse to her and also Mrs Madelaine Maplethorpe who helped in her search

The Panto comes just in time to benefit from the completion of our Audio/Lighting Project. Early last year, Stephen (an Electronics Engineer and musician) suggested that the facilities of the Village Hall were badly in need of improvement. At that time there was no installed audio system and the stage lighting consisted of two very old flood lamps controlled by two very old dimmer boxes. Stephen proposed a project to replace it all with modern equipment, but first he needed to find the money. So most of last year was spent in sending out requests for funding and by the end of the year we had raised sufficient grants and contributions to get the project off the stops.

We received generous donations from FunkNK, Billinghay Parish Council, Lincolnshire Co-op and Twells of Billinghay, with B.A.D.Ass and the Billinghay Village Hall Committee each contributing to make up the total needed for the project. We now have a

professional 1000 watt PA system installed behind stage which links wirelessly to a fully mobile sound mixing desk and two active speakers for the back of the Hall. There are now three chorus microphones to pick up songs and voices on stage together with four wireless microphone systems to be worn by performers. The lighting has been completely replaced with new LED spot lights and flood lights that are wirelessly controlled from a new mobile lighting panel. All of the mobile equipment has been kitted out with protective carrying cases to keep everything together and to avoid damage.

Of course, the proof of the pudding will be in the eating so we are looking forward to our Panto production where we will be using our new facilities for the very first time. We hope that they will add to the performance both in the new effects we can use and in the better enjoyment of our audience as they should now all get to hear what is happening on stage. I can report that all three performances are now sold out so we look forward to seeing you at the Village Hall. Don't forget that it is your job to shout "He's behind you" and "Oh no you don't" or whatever comes to mind.
