Hello from Billinghay Parish Council and welcome to the latest edition of the Billinghay Times.

These are strange, uncertain and unprecedented times for us all, but in true Billinghay spirit, the community has come together to support its residents and neighbouring communities, whether this be painting and displaying rainbows and teddy bears for "trails" around the village, setting up and volunteering for village and beyond initiatives to help with shopping and collecting prescriptions, or checking up on neighbours and friends at this time of need. Thank you to everyone.

As you will know the Parish Council, Bethel Baptist Church and Lincolnshire Co-op have set up a scheme for volunteers to shop for those who are in isolation or cannot get to the store for other reasons. A huge thank you must go to Sam at the Co-op for responding so swiftly to the request for support and to Richard at the Baptist Church who has done a sterling job of rounding up volunteers to cover all areas of the village as well as being out and about collecting and delivering shopping and sharing information as required.

We are all in this together, and together we will come through this and out the other side. Just remember to be kind to yourself, to stay in, and do your best to stay safe and well. Please take time to read the information about the local support that is available in this newsletter.

Although the Parish Office is closed and no face-to-face meetings are being held, to comply with government guidelines, council business is continuing as normal. The Clerk can be contacted by phone on 07483346143 or by email on <u>billinghaypc@gmail.com</u> on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday between 9.15am and 3.00pm. It is hoped that virtual meetings will take place by Zoom (as agreed at national level) so actions can be agreed, as no resolutions can be made without a meeting taking place.

In other news, the Parish Council is supporting the application for the extension of the Village Hall. The planning application can be viewed, and commented on, via the NKDC Planning Portal: <u>www.n-kesteven.gov.uk/planningonline</u> and entering the planning reference number (20/0429/FUL) into the search box.

Although the grass cutting contractors are not currently able to work, the Parish Council has arranged for a path to be cut around the playing field so residents and their canine companions, can enjoy a daily walk and some fresh air.

Looking ahead, the Parish Council has agreed for the outdoor play equipment (such as the climbing wall) to be brought to the village, hopefully in the summer holidays at NO COST to the young people or their families. However, this will be COVID-19 willing, so please look out for further details.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Practice is using **AskMyGP** to allow patients to message the surgery directly. Rather than having to wait for an appointment this system means that your medical query should be dealt with the same day (if you message on weekdays until 4pm). This service is available for all Doctor and Practitioner appointments. If you need to see a Practice Nurse or Health Care Assistant, e.g. for a long-term condition, review, injection, blood test or a smear test, please phone the surgery.

IF YOU <u>HAVE</u> INTERNET ACCESS

ASKMYGP means that you can request help from the Practice when, where and how it suits you. Enjoy feeling more in control as you ask for help securely from your smartphone, tablet or computer. Bookmark the link in your browser so you don't forget. Access AskMyGP.

IF YOU DO NOT HAVE INTERNET ACCESS

You can contact the Practice by telephone and your request will be sent to the clinician who will contact you that day and you will be managed by phone or invited in to see the clinician. Contact us on 01526 860490.

DISPENSARY CHANGES

During this outbreak, the Dispensary is no longer accepting paper copies of prescriptions. To request your medication, please go online and order (speak with reception if you do not have an account). If you do not have internet access, phone the Dispensary on 01526 869806. Dispensary may not be able to answer the phone so please leave a CLEAR message with your NAME, DATE OF BIRTH, CONTACT MUMBER and REQUEST. If you are unable to pronounce the name of the drug you can spell it out. Your medication will be available as soon as possible but may not be within the normal 72-hour turn-around. Please DO NOT order medication if you have unopened boxes. Adequate supplies are available if everyone orders normally.

Patients are no longer being allowed into the Dispensary to collect medication. Please go to the side window to collect. Please have **ID** with you if you are collecting for someone else. The Practice has created a make-shift queuing system to help maintain Social Distancing (2m).

Please look at the website daily <u>www.billinghaymedicalpractice.co.uk</u> if you have internet access, as new information is added regularly.

Care Quality Commission (Annual Review)

The Practice was inspected in late 2016, when the rating was "Good", but the aim is to be "Outstanding". A telephone call with the CQC was arranged to take place late February which involved answering 19 'set' questions. This was carried out by our Practice Manager and GP Partners. The outcome is that the rating remains "Good". There will be another review in 2021.

Veteran Friendly GP Practice Accreditation

Over the next five years, NHS England and NHS Improvement, together with the Royal College of Practitioners, are rolling out the veteran friendly GP Practice accreditation scheme across England. This scheme, which is intended to help ensure Practices are best equipped to care for veterans and their families, has already accredited over 700 surgeries. Billinghay Medical Practice is working towards this accreditation, and will code Patient's records if they are a known military veteran.

Our Mental Health

The coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak means that life is changing for all of us for a while. It may cause you to feel anxious, stressed, worried, sad, bored, lonely or frustrated. In spite of the current National crisis we have received our usual contribution from our Skirth Road resident this month and this centres on one of his many sporting activities

Quite a long time after the the passing of my mother's death had left me living alone in the bungalow that I had shared with her I decided it was time to have a look in all of the cupboards and wardrobes and nooks and crannies that I had hitherto not seen the need to venture into. Immediately after her death I cleared her main wardrobe and drawers of clothes but did little else, It was clear that Mother also did very little downsizing after my fathers death and many of his possessions were still around the place. Hidden in the back of the cupboard I found a carrier bag and this contained a cylindrical leather case that aroused my interest. Opening it up I came across my dad's set of 2 bowls woods. I was talking about this at a church coffee morning and it was suggested that I could donate them to Walcott Short Mat Bowls Club which met on a Monday night in the village hall. I decided to do this on a Monday soon after and on walking down the drive I thought that I could stay and play that evening before giving away my bowls. I did not expect to be any good partly because I had not played before and also because my woods were not very good. I knew this because I remember asking my father every week when he came back from bowls if he had won to be invariably told that he had lost but that was only because his woods did not have as good a bias as everyone else's and were not heavy enough. I remember asking mum why he did not get some better ones and she said that there were two reasons. One was that he did not like spending money and the other was he would not want the problem of thinking up another excuse when he continued to lose every week.

I arrived at the Walcott Village Hall on a Monday evening and was warmly welcomed as is the case at all clubs where extra fees are needed to pay the rent. The intricacies of short mat bowls were explained to me. A piece of wood in the middle you have to bowl around and a line drawn across the mat that you have to cross for the bowl to count, I was shown which way round to hold my bowl to get it to bend in the correct manner and I set off and delivered my first bowl towards the jack (the little yellow ball at the other end of the mat that you have to get near to) and hit the wood in the middle. Oy next go I went a bit wider and my bowl bid not turn at all but careered straight off the mat into the wall. On the next end I decided to bowl the other side of the wood (backhand) and promptly hit the wood again, A slight adjustment for my second bowl meant that it again careered off the side of the mat. My dad was right "THESE BOWLS ARE USELESS"

I decided to carry on in future weeks and try and improve and when my accuracy improved my next problem was power (technically known as weight). Despite being fairly straight very few of my bowls counted as they were always short of the line or shot straight over the end of the mat. After many weeks I improved this aspect of the game as

well and was confident that most of my bowls would finish in the required area of the mat. I was no longer a complete liability so I began to think a little bit more about tactics and where precisely my bowls should go in order to help my team win the end. To win the end you have to have your bowls nearer to the jack than the opponents have when all the bowls have been bowled but at Walcott the trick is to persuade your opponents that your bowls are nearer and I began to realise that this was an art form. If you are quick a confident and authoritative "That's the nearest" spoken simultaneously as you pick up one of your team's bowls before anybody else realises what is going on may do the trick. Often this is not possible as there are several players clustered around the bowls as the final bowl is delivered . I had seen on TV that when there is doubt about which bowl is the nearest the referee comes on with a special measuring tool (a piece of string encased in plastic) and every short mat bowls club has one. However as the evening is only fun and the result is not important it is not worth getting this out and wasting the 30-45 seconds that it takes to measure so half a dozen bowlers will discuss it for two or three minutes and then measure after that if they cannot agree. I have a suspicion that the time wasting argument is a red herring and the real reason for attempting to forgo the measuring instrument is that many club bowlers are of an age when if they get down to measure it they may find it hard to get up.

One's improvement at the game can obviously be gauged by where you are able to land your bowls but there is another way, which is the reaction of your fellow bowlers when you make a complete hash of a shot. A beginner who crashes his bowl into the central wooden plank will receive encouraging comments such as "bad luck" or "nearly" or " it only hit the end of the wood". A more competent player who hits the wood will see that no-one is looking at him. His own team trying to hide their annoyance and the opposition trying to hide a smirk. However when you roll a ball into the central plank and the whole room guffaws you know that you are really rated as a bowler.
