COUNCIL MEETING REPORTS

DECEMBER 2018

Clerk's Update

The Clerk reported:

- There are still three Councillor vacancies and no applicants
- Highways matters problems with drain covers on the High Street and Walcott Road have been re-reported
- The Parochial Church Council are happy for the Old Cemetery to be developed along the lines outlined. They also pointed out that the tarmac path in the Old Churchyard needs repairing. The Clerk was asked to get quotes.
- Tree works have been completed.
- She had spoken to LCC representative regarding the Lafford land. He offered two dates and it was agreed that Councillors would would meet with him on Thursday 13 December.
- Parking outside the Co-op was causing problems still and many suggestions were put forward but nothing that was viable emerged. The Clerk was asked to request traffic warden assistance to see if this would deter the illegal parking.

Planning Matters

An application for an extension to 3 Shire Close was discussed but no specific comments were made to pass on to Planning.

Neighbourhood Plan Update

The latest draft has been discussed with NKDC and amendments are being implemented.

Remaining problem relates to mapping within the plan and this is being sorted with NKDC. A referendum is now likely to be held in January or February.

Money was requested to publicise the referendum and it was agreed unanimously that up to £300 could be spent for this purpose.

Highways and Police Matters

LCC had offered an amount for the Parish Council to take over the verge cutting from them. The Clerk had asked the Parish Grass Cutter to do a trial run and let us have his comments re extra cost etc. This has taken place and was an improvement on the existing. It was agreed unanimously that the Parish Council accept the LCC offer.

Correspondence

Most Items had already been circulated to Councillors.

The only additional item was a letter of resignation from Cllr Passfield. The Council wanted to officially record their thanks for all his hard work on their behalf and to accept his offer of assistance on the production of official documentation. The Clerk was asked to write accordingly.

Finance

Financial Activity information since the last meeting have been circulated. It was agreed unanimously to accept the figures.



Burial Ground and Allotment Business

The new dimensions for plots in Ashes Areas 3 and 4 were discussed and agreed. A new template will be required. It was agreed that a Notice Board in the Cemetery would be a good idea and the Clerk was asked to include an item on the next agenda.

The Clerk was asked to send a Condolence card for Tyrone Baker who had been a Councillor for many years.

The Clerk also reported that late afternoon burials were a problem for the grave digger because of the fading light and was trying to ensure that such instances were avoided wherever possible.

Councillors Reports

The following issues were raised:

- Councillors asked if letters regarding the unsafe headstones had been issued. The Clerk advised that she was compiling the necessary information to carry out the task.
- The Xmas tree has been erected and the Clerk was asked to write letters of thanks to the residents who assisted in this task.
- Councillors were advised that the Fire Service Carol singing tour around the village would be on 16th December. Details of the Xmas Tree Blessing were discussed and agreed.
- A District Councillor advised that the Council were consulting residents to find out how they felt their area was developing etc. She also mentioned that an "expert" would be addressing the Cluster meeting on the 14th January.
- A Councillor reported that repairs had been made to part of Mill Road and some of the 40mph signs had been removed.
- Entry details for Ringmoor House were relayed to Council to prevent them from having to stand outside in inclement weather.
- Problems at the Whyche Community Rooms were reported. This related to

faulty heating and out of date PAT testing. The Clerk agreed to advise NKDC.

- Problems with waste collection at Bramble Close were again reported. District Councillors suggested that the "depot" be contacted and requested to sort out the problem with the residents.
- A problem with "fly tipping" was reported near the Dorrington Dyke Bridge.

JANUARY 2019

Clerk's Update

The Clerk reported:

- Gina Johnson-Hart NKDC Officer contacted the clerk regarding Walks Festival 2019 which takes place 13-20 July Billinghay would be included.
- The Whyche Community Rooms problems had been reported to NKDC
- Large bin had been placed at Bramble Close so all refuse for these properties can be placed into the same bin.

New applications for, or amendments or cancellations of postal votes and amendments or cancellations of existing proxy votes must reach the Electoral Registration Officer at North Kesteven District Council, Council Offices, Kesteven Street, Sleaford, NG34 7EF by 5pm on Wednesday 20 February 2019.
- 4. New applications to vote by proxy at this referendum must reach the Electoral Registration Officer at North Kesteven District Council, Council Offices, Kesteven Street, Sleaford, NG34 7EF by 5pm on Wednesday 27 February 2019.
- 5. Applications to vote by emergency proxy at this referendum on grounds of physical incapacity or for work/service reasons must reach the Electoral Registration Officer at North Kesteven District Council, Council Offices, Kesteven Street, Sleaford, NG34 7EF by **5pm on Thursday 7 March 2019**. The physical incapacity must have occurred after 5pm on **Wednesday 27 February 2019**. To apply on the grounds of work/service, the person must have become aware that they cannot go to the polling station in person after 5pm on **Wednesday 27 February 2019**.

Happy New Year to all our fabulous pool supporters! It seems a little late to be saying that now as it is February as I write this, but this has been our first opportunity during the quiet winter season.

So, as we embark on our 2019 season preparations, I can bring you some fantastic news that we have been keeping tight lipped over since last spring. A lot of time and energy has been spent and many minds have been blown trying to keep abreast of all the legal comings and goings, but we can finally announce we have successfully negotiated a new 25yr lease for the Pool!

As a community, you may or may not be aware that our lease was renewed every 10yrs, but this has impacted greatly on the types of funding we could apply for. You can appreciate I'm sure, that any grant given that is of a significant amount will need to be justified with a long-term commitment and that is something the Pool could not guarantee. 10yrs was simply not enough to get more than relatively small quantities. As most of us know we desperately need to update and renovate the pool area, so this was our first big step. With help from our Parish, District and County Councillors we were able to negotiate this lease with LCC and although nothing is ever guaranteed, we can at least aim to provide the community and beyond with the continuation of our fabulous little gem for more many more years.

With this re-negotiation came the opportunity to achieve official use of Billinghay Primary school car park during weekends and the school holidays. We can now advertise our facility with "accessible parking available at peak times" and it will go some way to allowing visitors from further afield with cars and specifically, our less abled visitors to have better access. So, with all that good news on the table we must give an enormous amount of thanks to Mr. Richard Allen, headmaster at Billinghay Primary and also the Anglican Diocese who both appreciated our difficulties and fully supported us in our quest. Specific mention also goes to County Councillor Barry Young, Carol Willingham the PC clerk, (for all the guidance you have given us over the last few years), all of our local Parish Councillors and especially for all of you, our customers, who have shown us that you want Billinghay Pool to stay for the next generation. As ever we are very grateful for all your contributions that keep coming in to help keep our fabulous pool running.

By the time you read this article we would already have had our AGM and put together our committee for the coming season. Any information that we need to circulate from that meeting (26th Feb), we will announce in the next publication along our running dates and timings for the 2019 season.



Many children have a piggy bank but do they really understand why saving is important and the different types of saving.

These days buying on credit is easy and part of day to day life for most people, but it does mean that items are more expensive, or you pay interest over the period you pay it off. If our children can understand the advantages of saving now they will benefit for the rest of their lives!

Here are a few great ways to help children.

#### Three pots

A piggy bank is great but often children go out and spend it all on one thing. The Three Pot idea looks at the length of time you are saving for.

Pot 1 – Spend now – for a magazine or a toy on their next shopping trip because you have to live for the moment sometimes!

Pot 2 – Save in the short term – perhaps you are going on holiday and the children would like to have some spending money for that special trip



Pot 3 – Save for the longer term – encouraging children to save a little for a long-term goal – perhaps buying a car (for those

teenagers) or a new bike. This instils the idea that you have to work hard to be able to afford the bigger things in life.

For older children you could agree a savings plan, for example every time a Grandparent gives them £5 for helping out, they put £1 in pot 1, £1.50 in Pot 2 and £2.50 in Pot 3.

#### **Competitive savings**

This seems to have worked very well in school recently with a 5p challenge where each class had to bring in 5 pence coins to fill a bottle and see which class collected the most.

At home this could work between siblings by setting a time limit to see who can save the most. To earn a bit of 'pocket money' they could do jobs round the house or help out friends and neighbours. At the end of the period the one who has saved the most gets an extra bonus payment.

Having a savings goal could also work well with older children and teach them the value of their favourite things. Children are unlikely to realise how much a bike or iPad costs but if they have to save up, perhaps a proportion of it, in order to get the latest 'must-have' they would soon realise how hard we all work to keep them in the lifestyle they are accustomed to!





Our correspondent from Skirth Road has been waxing lyrical again as can be seen below: Everyone must know that I am always pleased to get Christmas and New Year over and this year it was St Michael & All Angels Church Billinghay who provided two special events to start the year.

Wednesday 9th of January saw the induction of our new vicar The Rev Steve Holt. This service concluded with the new vicar ringing the church bell 16 times, one for each year that he intends to stay. This has been seen as good news by everyone that I have spoken to. The service was followed by refreshments in the Community Room prepared by the matriarch of St Michaels & All Angels and her team. Now the matriarch always provides excellent food but that night everyone gasped in astonishment at the quality and quantity of what she had provided. I was told some days afterwards that there had been quite a lot of food left over but I will accept none of the blame for that. I did my utmost to minimise the surplus.

The following Sunday was Plough Sunday. On Plough Sunday two of the 6 churches in the benefice hold a service and following the second service there is a ploughman's lunch. This year it was Billinghay's turn to provide the lunch. I arrived at the church and took a seat next to my friend Helen. Immediately 4 ladies in the pew behind moved quickly to the other side of the church. I felt a little self-conscious because although I had got ready in a rush I had taken a shower. However it transpired that it was nothing to do with me and they had fled in panic as they had realised that they were in the pew normally occupied by the matriarch. Helen shouted across that the matriarch would not be attending this service as she was in the hall preparing the lunch. They came back as quickly as they left clearly eager to have the honour of sitting in the pew usually occupied by the matriarch. At this point I realised what a difficult task The Reverend Steve had that day. He had to keep the congregation interested in the church service while they were eagerly awaiting another culinary feast from the matriarch

I have to say that he did a fine job as he began his sermon with the following story

There was a young lady who wanted to get married, so she asked her father for a dowry. "Well Daughter" he said "I haven't got much but I would like to see you marry a farmer. I reckon I could set you up with a fine plough". So the young lady advertised through a dating agency "good looking young lady with excellent cooking skills, experience of farm life and owning a fine plough seeks eligible bachelor for marriage. Further details and photo on request." A few days later she received this letter "Dear Madam I read your advert with interest. I too would like to meet an eligible young lady such as yourself. I look forward to meeting you and getting to know you.

I could of course, if required, tell you his full sermon verbatim but space does not allow.

After the service it was across to the Community Rooms and I sat down at a table and landed right in the middle of a debate over the big news of the day. There was to be no raffle. I asked why not and there was a suggestion that it had may been decided not to have one because no one else had ever had a raffle on Plough Sunday. Now I do not know if this is true but what a shame if it is. What a good job Professor Christian Barnard did not take that view when he performed the world's first heart transplant. What would our lives be like now if the man who designed the motor car had decided that he would not bother because nobody had done it before?. If it is true let us hope that the people who took the decision have enough years of their life left to rediscover (or discover) the spirit of adventure.

It was time for the meal and I started to butter my roll but not very successfully. I always keep my spread out of the fridge at home as experience has told that keeping it in the fridge keeps it so hard that my bread is pulled to pieces when I try to apply it. I was having a real problem here but luckily help was at hand. Rose ( a hard working member of the matriarch's team) arrived with some warm dishes in preparation for the soup. I put several "sachets" of butter in my dish and put Mavis' dish inside mine and within 15 seconds the whole table had butter that they could spread. At this point Helen commented on how young I looked (her actual words were "he has not changed one bit since primary school") The vegetable soup arrived and I do not like vegetables or vegetable soup. However this vegetable soup had been made by the matriarch and was guite unlike any vegetable soup that I had ever tasted before. I would never have known that there was any vegetables in it because it tasted just like tomato soup (my favourite soup even though I don't eat tomatoes). Fortunately the matriarch had prepared enough for me to have a second bowl. The soup dishes were collected and we were given crusty bread and butter to accompany the ploughman's lunch. I am here indebted to Sandra (another hard-working member of the matriarch's team) for taking the trouble to provide me with two more warm dishes to prepare the butter. I am not a lover of salad and had to forego quite a lot of the excellent cuisine on offer but I did not go hungry as I digested several pieces of cheese and pork pie moistened by some lettuce and cucumber and several large spoonfuls of sweet pickle. The meal was concluded with hot drinks and Celebrations chocolates

I went home looking forward to the next church meal and wondering how many more the matriarch would provide. Maybe she will provide another stunning buffet to mark the retirement of Reverend Steve and retire at the same time. After all, she shows no sign of slowing down and in 16 years time she will not be that much over 100.

### **BILLINGHAY CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL**



Welcome! We are now well into Term 3 and nearly half way through another academic year at school. Between now and Easter the children in Years 3/4 have their residential visit to Rand Farm Park. We are all looking forward to this and hope for fine weather.

We have used some of our Sports Premium funding to have new markings laid on the playground at the front of school. This gives us 2 full sized netball courts which can also be used for many other sports such as basketball, hockey and 5 a side football. We can now host more competitions within the Carres Outreach group of schools. Continuing the sporting theme our pupils have represented the school and taken part in a number of sporting competitions since September. From the start of January our school team won our Goalball qualifying event with 3 other schools and progressed to the final. We have taken part in Sports Hall Athletics at Carres Grammar School where our team of 12 Year 5/6 pupils came 12th out of 23 schools and our Curling team came 4th out of 17 schools at their competition. Next up is Water Polo then indoor rowing at Carres Fitness Suite in Sleaford. After the half term holiday we plan to compete in competitions in: Basketball, Orienteering, Tri Golf and Hockey. So far we are well on the way to yet again achieving the School Games Gold Award.


During a busy half term since Christmas and upcoming events:

- All classes have carried out work focusing on e Safety (to coincide with the national Safer Internet Day) and our Kingfisher (YR), Wagtail (Year 1) and Toucan (Year 2) classes have carried out work linked to Chinese New Year.
- We had a mobile planetarium in our hall as some classes have a space topic theme.
- Our local PCSO, Nic Woolerton, has visited school to talk to all classes about stranger danger.
- Our School Council are looking at ways as to how the school can help to reduce the amount of plastic that is used in our lives and how we can help to save the oceans.
- We are continuing to enhance our provision for maths by taking part in an Action research project on maths mastery with the East Midlands East Maths Hub.
- We are part of some research groups with other schools and are using research extensively to develop the vocabulary of our children which in turn will impact on reading.
- National research carried out by the Education Endowment Foundation has shown that Year 7 readers who were offered Accelerated Reader made additional progress in reading compared to similar pupils. Accelerated Reader (AR) is an internet-based software package which assesses a pupil's reading age, and suggests books that match pupils' needs and interests. Pupils take computerised quizzes on the books and earn AR points as they progress. We have had AR in school for a few years now and we are further investing in library books for our pupils to supplement our well stocked library. Our school data backs up the national data in that pupils who are reading more and quizzing more with AR are generally making more progress in reading.
- We use Times Tables Rockstars in school which is an online resource to support children in learning their times tables. There are 6 different games to play either individually or against others. This term we have a 'Battle of the Bands' competition between 3 classes to see which class can earn the most points for the correct answers.

• World Book Day will be celebrated on the 7th March with the children coming to school dressed as their favourite book character and parents being invited in to school to 'share a book' with their child/ren.

We look forward to continued success in the remainder of the spring term and the lead up to Easter.



### Land at The former Lafford School Site



Lincolnshire County Council have recently contacted Billinghay Parish Council regarding with an offer to the Parish to lease land at the Lafford School site behind the area for the proposed houses fronting on to Fen Road.

This offer was part of the conditions for acceptance of the Planning Application for the housing development. There is no option to buy and the Parish need not lease all the land (3.8 acres).

Conditions applying in the lease would include:

- No erection of permanent buildings •
- If land was required for expansion of the school, this would be taken • albeit with reasonable notice
- The charge for leasing the whole area would start at £970 per annum (Not negotiable) and be reviewed on a regular basis.

The Parish Council have been asked to respond to the offer as soon as possible, with details of proposed usage should they wish to take up the lease.

Ideas are needed as to possible use and, at present, suggestions put forward include:

- The erection of a Community Building for use as a Scout Hut (although • also available for other organisations). The building would have to be of a temporary nature.
- Another possible use would be for garden allotments. We have a list of • people who expressed an interest in acquiring such an allotment but this was compiled some years ago. If you are interested in having a garden allotment, let us know.

If you would like to get involved with this project, have other ideas for the possible use of this area or have any relevant comments, the Parish Council would like to hear from you.


