COUNCIL REPORT

Hello and happy New Year from Billinghay Parish Council

As usual the council and councillors have been very busy. The three new councillors are settling in well to life in public office and have commenced training to help them fulfil their role. The clerk and chairman have commenced their Qualification in Local Council Administration (CiLCA), with 2 study days under their belts and 30 assignments ahead of them.

The Christmas tree blessing ceremony took place under the stars with free refreshments and a selection of community and local stalls in the Community Rooms. This event, is becoming a tradition in Billinghay and as with all the best community events much team work and planning goes on behind the scenes and on the evening. Thank you to everyone who helped along the way and came along to make the evening such a success. Next year we hope to build on or links with school, church and local businesses to ensure the event is the very best it can be.

The committees of the council have formed and are planning their projects for year 2020/2021 and budget planning is also underway.

The Emergency Planning co-ordinators attended the Resilient Lincolnshire conference at Grantham on October 21st which was a great way to hear about how communities can plan for emergencies in their areas. Training takes place on 22 January 2020 for the co-ordinators and volunteers, with Lincolnshire Fire and Rescue and NKDC providing expertise and The Ship providing lunch. Please note that offering to volunteer does not obligate you in any way, but it is necessary to have a co-ordinated approach, so please do contact the office if you can help in any way.

Recognising the enormous value of groups and clubs and the contribution by their volunteers, especially in a rural village like ours, at the annual finance meeting in November we awarded just over £5,000 in grants to various Billinghay clubs and venues including:

- Billinghay Athletic Football Club £1770 towards a shower room refit
- 1st Billinghay Scouts £250.00 for a camping fridge
- B.A.D.ASS £500 towards light and sound equipment
- Billinghay Village Hall & Playing Field £500.00 towards a CCTV system
- Billinghay & District Community Swimming Pool £1,900 towards picnic benches
- Billinghay Parents' Forum £200.00 for events for children and parents
- 2nd Billinghay Brownies £500 for activity packs.
- War Memorial Flowers -up to £450 in the year

A grey-water risk assessment is being carried out in Walcott Road cemetery to ensure the burial ground meets with current regulations. Monitoring wells are being sunk and three councillors are being trained in how to use these. The cemetery is only suitable for single-depth graves which already adheres to our cemetery policy.

Sadly we have said goodbye to long standing councillors Charles Kirk and Roger Miller. Both have achieved a huge amount behind the scenes and both will be much missed. Thank you both for everything you have done for the council, the village, and for the community.

At our November meeting, Cllr Cassidy was elected as Vice-Chairman of the parish council and we welcome him to this role.

The Community Speed Watch Scheme is gathering momentum with sessions being held three times a week. Feedback from residents and motorists has been very positive. There are on average 340 vehicles an hour during the sessions, with approx. 12 vehicles found to be speeding.

Following excellent feedback, the Environment Enforcement Warden has seen an increase in his hours and continues to provide a service regarding anti-social behaviour, fly-tipping, fly-posting, littering and dog fouling. Cautions have been issued regarding the partaking of illegal substances and for fly-posting, and from now on fines will be issued for offences, when required.

As you may have heard, the Parish Office will no longer be funded as a local access point (LAPS) for NKDC and at the time of writing the clerk and councillors were due to meet with NKDC to discuss a way forward. There will be no job losses as a result of this funding cut and the office staff will strive as always to provide support for Billinghay residents.

Looking at the year ahead, a new community building for the playing fields on Fen Road remains on the agenda, although much work and consultation will be required to make this a possibility.

As always, Billinghay Parish Council is here to serve and represent its electorate and we look forward to continuing to make the village a safe and thriving village for residents, businesses and visitors to enjoy.

This does, of course, give us an opportunity to include another poem. This one is by the famous local poet Bernard Gilbert and related to an earlier flood in Billinghay when the banks of the Skirth gave way . People familiar with the Lincolnshire dialect may need to translate!!

THE BANK BREAKS

Yis, sir, we had a fearful time, 'twas thotty year to-day, Sin our owd river burst 'er banks and carried all awaay. I never shall forget it, no, not when my hair turns grey.

The month it was December, 'twas on a Sunday too,
An' all the week it 'ad been raining fit to soak us through,
Our drains wor all bung-full, and we was bothered what to do.

The parson offered up a prayer for them in storms at sea, But it o'most looked as if the foak to be afraid was we, Wi' watter, watter, everywheer, as far as you could see.

Just as owd John, the clerk, was readin' out hymn forty-one, Our policeman looked inside the door and sez, "Excuse me, John, A-stoppin' o' your service, but they say the bank ez gone."

Wi' that the congregation all roaz up to their feet, An down the aisle went pourin' fast to get into the street. The parson an owd John was first together, a dead heat.

'Twas blowin' wild and dreadful, the rain beat in your faace,
We took no heed to that at all, but run on like a raace,
Rate past the school, along the bank until we found the plaace.

We found it plenty soon enough, a greaat owdacious gap, The watter pourin' through it as 'ard as it could lap, Gettin' worser every minnit, enough to scare a chap.

It wor a gashly sight, an' all, the watter black and strong,
Noa light exceptin' wheer a man 'ad brought a torch along,
An' us all clustered round 'im, scared, as cloas as we could throng.

The wind went tearin' awful overhead, and worse'n it, The roarin' of the current as the bank went bit by bit, Whilst people shouted in the dark like lost men in a pit.

Then lanterns drawed up one by one, a moast amaazin' sight, Like fireflies aflittin' in the middle of the night; It looked just like a nightmare by the flicker of their light.

Theer wadn't nowt as could be 'elped until the day 'ad come, But when it did, Lor, what a sight! Far as the eye could roam Was one great waste of watter, just like a sea at hoame. All in the fen was houses like ships upon the seas,
Wi' foaks at bedroom winders in watter to their knees;
An 'ere an there was stickin' out the tops o' stacks an' trees.

Me an my cousin Arthur we set off in a boat, It was a rum experience to find oursens afloat, Where crops an 'edges orter stan', and couldn't yet see nowt.

'Osses come swimmin' past us, then cows an' bullocks too, An when we got to shaller ground the foaks wor waadin' through, A-carryin' their cloas an goods; it wor a strange to-do.

One woman wor a-paggin' three childer by 'ersen,
Then puoyin' in a saltin' tub come two poor drowned-out men
Who'd brought a cargo looad o' pigs from out the bottom fen.

We 'elped foaks outer windows, we 'elped 'em outer trees, They stepped off roofs and chimney stacks as ready as you please, Which wa'dnt to be wondered at, for it were fit to freeze.

Well sir, we got 'em all away up safely past the Mill, On to the village, high an' dry - we stands upon a hill, Like all Fen villages must do unless they wanter fill.

In time we got the hole blocked up wi' barges full o' sand Packed tight in bags and floated round an sunk rate on the land Or in the water; anyhow, we got the bank to stand.

We didn't do it all at once; the watter slived soa meean; Three times it rose, an brok our works wi' scourin' undernean, But we dogged at 'er an stuck to 'er, an last we did it cleean.

O' course, sir, once upon a time we wor an island 'ere, Wi' marsh, an fen, an salt sea-water, round us everywheer, Yes, just a fishin' village, this, in ancient times I hear.

It's bad enuf when one bank breaks an only floods one fen, But if yon owd original sea bank should bust 'ersen, Or if the Boston Sluice should goa then it would be Amen.

'Coz all on us would waaken up I'm thinking by the sea,
As quick an cheap a trip as theer would ever like to be;
'Twould mean us steppin' back a thousand year quite easily.

The bank is heightened everywhere, and yet, I can't explain, But when it comes to Christmas time an starts to pour wi' rain, We all expects to 'ear as 'ow the bank has brok again.

We have received our usual contribution from our Skirth Road resident who has chosen to write about his experiences with raffles!!

I wrote some time ago about raffle prizes and having continued to attend and support raffles I have become very interested in the psychology of the selling of tickets. Tickets are nearly always cloakroom tickets sold at £1 a strip. I was at a quiz once for a very worthy cause that had attracted fantastic prizes from local businesses and individuals. To save work they planned to sell tickets for £1 per ticket An excellent idea. Less folding and tearing and having a background in probability and statistics I know (I think most people would find it rather obvious anyway) that each ticket still has the same chance of winning a prize but also prevents someone winning numerous prizes as you cannot win two prizes if you only have one ticket. However that was abandoned as the first team to be asked to buy tickets refused unless they got a strip for £1. I would love to know the psychology behind the thinking.

The organisers clearly wished to maximise their profit so sold strips of 5 for £1. There are many things to think about selling raffle tickets if you want to maximise the profits and if more money can be raised by wasting 80% of the tickets then do it although it would be interesting to know if The Green Party would do it

Having more than one colour is also advisable. I think that it is the case that if there is more than one colour there are a large number of people who would have one of each colour. There must be a limit to this however. If there were 20 different books of different colours and hues and shades people would not want to part with £20 so what is the optimum number?. I don't suppose it will form part of a PhD thesis in a psychology department at a university anywhere although having read about many bizarre research projects that have attracted grants I would not be totally surprised. Until I have the opportunity to read such detailed research I would guess that as 5 would be a good number to have as is a fairly round number and is also the value of our lowest denomination bank note. So with 5 colours a £5 note can be tendered with no difficult decisions about colours and no change to contend with. Metal change can be a real pain to people who do not carry bags or purses.

I often ask myself why people so often buy one of each colour. I think part of it must be to prolong the anticipation of winning. When a ticket is drawn out "yellow ticket" you immediately feel deflated if you do no have one but your interest is maintained for slightly longer if you have one so buying one of each keeps the interest going.

Keeping people interested is a skill that MCs of raffles need to be adept at. I have on many occasions been to a neighbouring village where there is a man who has mastered the art to perfection..

The number is not read out straight away but in stages. "There's a 4 in it" (still in) "there's a 3 in it " (yes I have 431 to 435) and there's a 7 in it so its 437 (oh blast but he kept me

interested). But it gets better "there's a 3 in it" "there's an 8 in it" "and there is a 9 between them so its 398". So you don't know the winning number for quite a while because he reads the digits in a random order only finally revealing the winning number having kept the maximum number of people interested for as long as possible on the way. Genius!!!!. Of course it takes time and I remember one big function where he was waiting with his bucket of tickets. The chairman announced "People have been very generous tonight we have 84 prizes" immediately the bucket was taken from him by another committee member to do the draw. I felt cheated. I rarely go to bed before 1:30 am anyway.


