Dear Residents

Billinghay Parish Council hope you enjoyed a peaceful Christmas and wish you all a happy and healthy 2021.

The end of the year was a busy time for the Council. The Clerk and Cllr Catlett laid wreaths at the War Memorial at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in remembrance of Armistice Day.





At the finance meeting held on 16 November 2020 community grant funding was awarded to the following well deserving village groups:

- Billinghay Athletic Junior Football Club £497.45 (for equipment)
- 1st Billinghay Scout Group £459 90 (for camping equipment)
- Billinghay Village Hall & Playing Field Committee £1,000 (towards expected building costs for building regulations
- Billinghay and District Community Pool £3886 (flooring and floor preparation)
- Billinghay Bowls Club £650 (preparation of the green and insurance.)

Although BPC does not normally award funding for running costs, in 2020 the Council was keen to support groups to ensure they remained active and available for the community to enjoy.

Cllr Locke resigned as Chairman of the Council in December due to work and other commitments, but remains an active member of the team.

2021 is going to be a busy year with reviews of the Neighbourhood Plan, Emergency Plan and the Billinghay Times to be undertaken. If you have an ideas, suggestions or comments or would like to be involved in any way, please let the Clerk know.

The Parish Office remains closed with staff working from home, and all training and meetings being held remotely. Details of council and committee meetings are displayed on the notice-board and the public and press are always welcome to attend.

As you may be aware the Speed Watch Scheme has now been in operation for over a year now.

The results of the checks are collated centrally and we have received full details of the ones relating to Billinghay.

These are detailed below. Offending vehicles are defined as those exceeding 35mph within the 30 mph limit

Vehicles exceeding the speed limit are referred to the Police with the aim of educating drivers to reduce their speeds.

#### WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING?

#### Warrants:

Sleaford NPT has been involved in carrying out a number of warrants in the rural villages over the past few months. Large cannabis grows were found at North Kyme and Billinghay.

Approximately 4000 plants were seized and 11 persons arrested as a result from both cannabis grows.

#### Speedwatch Groups:

A number of rural villages are now joining the Community Speed Watch (CSW) Scheme.

The CSW is a scheme to allow trained volunteers to address speed concerns in their communities. Sleaford rural NPT have been training up volunteers and carrying out speed checks in the villages. Some groups have had the NPT accompany them in the roadside sessions. The schemes report the details of speeding vehicles in

specific areas where speed is of concern. The scheme also allows the public to get actively involved in monitoring the speed of vehicles travelling through their neighbourhood.

# ASKmyGP

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Practice is using **AskMyGP** to allow patients to message the surgery directly. Rather than having to wait for an appointment this system means that your medical query should be dealt with the same day (if you message on weekdays until 4pm). This service is available for all Doctor and Practitioner appointments. If you need to see a Practice Nurse or Health Care Assistant, e.g. for a long-term condition, review, injection, blood test or a smear test, please phone the surgery.

#### IF YOU <u>HAVE</u> INTERNET ACCESS

**ASKMYGP** means that you can request help from the Practice when, where and how it suits you. Enjoy feeling more in control as you ask for help securely from your smartphone, tablet or computer. Bookmark the link in your browser so you don't forget. Access AskMyGP.

#### IF YOU DO NOT HAVE INTERNET ACCESS

You can contact the Practice by telephone and your request will be sent to the clinician who will contact you that day and you will be managed by phone or invited in to see the clinician. Contact us on 01526 860490.

# DISPENSARY CHANGES

During this outbreak, the Dispensary is no longer accepting paper copies of prescriptions. To request your medication, please go online and order (speak with reception if you do not have an account). If you do not have internet access, phone the Dispensary on 01526 869806. Dispensary may not be able to answer the phone so please leave a CLEAR message with your NAME, DATE OF BIRTH, CONTACT MUMBER and REQUEST. If you are unable to pronounce the name of the drug you can spell it out. Your medication will be available as soon as possible but may not be within the normal 72-hour turn-around. Please DO NOT order medication if you have unopened boxes. Adequate supplies are available if everyone orders normally.

Patients are no longer being allowed into the Dispensary to collect medication. Please go to the side window to collect. Please have **ID** with you if you are collecting for someone else. The Practice has created a make-shift queuing system to help maintain Social Distancing (2m).

Please look at the website daily <u>www.billinghaymedicalpractice.co.uk</u> if you have internet access, as new information is added regularly.

#### Care Quality Commission (Annual Review)

The Practice was inspected in late 2016, when the rating was "Good", but the aim is to be "Outstanding". A telephone call with the CQC was arranged to take place late February which involved answering 19 'set' questions. This was carried out by our Practice Manager and GP Partners. The outcome is that the rating remains "Good". There will be another review in 2021.

#### Veteran Friendly GP Practice Accreditation

Over the next five years, NHS England and NHS Improvement, together with the Royal College of Practitioners, are rolling out the veteran friendly GP Practice accreditation scheme across England. This scheme, which is intended to help ensure Practices are best equipped to care for veterans and their families, has already accredited over 700 surgeries. Billinghay Medical Practice is working towards this accreditation, and will code Patient's records if they are a known military veteran.



### WILL THE BILLINGHAY BOYS PLEASE STAY BEHIND

Mick Wright or "Wrighty" as he was known was a well known character in Billinghay and served as a hard working Councillor for Billinghay Parish Council.

Over a period of many years, Mick gave a lot of time to research the lives of Billinghay people who served in both World Wars It was a project that was very dear to him and provides an insight of interest to many local families. During this time he made trips to the battlefields to visit as many graves of the fallen as he could.

He had hoped to put his research into a book for publication but never felt it was fully complete. Unfortunately, Mick passed away before his work came to fruition. He did, however, pass copies of his research to the Parish Council and it is split into two volumes:

- A volume detailing the involvement of Billinghay people during the conflicts
- A volume giving details of individuals and the role they played

We felt that the years of hard work that had gone into production of this research were worthy of publication and it is our intention of serialising Part One in forthcoming issues of the Newsletter starting below. Specific individual details can be given to rlations who may request them via the Parish Office.

#### FOREWORD

The idea for this book came to me when I was visiting the World War One Battlefields and cemeteries in Northern France with my late wife.

The first cemetery we visited was near Hazebrouck about 30 miles east of Calais and while looking through the register we came across the name of Ernest Gosling of Thorpe Ginley (sic), late of Blankney Fen. Ernest was Private 40388, 4<sup>th</sup> Battalion Worcestershire Regiment. He died on 21<sup>st</sup> April 1918 aged 21 years. He is buried in La Kreule Military Cemetery, Hazebrouck. On our return home we searched the local memorials and were unable to find his name on any of them and it saddened me to think that he was a forgotten man in his own country.

However, I have been able to discover that Ernest was born in Metheringham c1896 and was the son of John B. and Elizabeth Gosling. In 1901 they were living in Blankney Fen where John was an agricultural labourer. They had two other children William B. born c1896 and John G. born 1900. Also living in Blankney Fen were William and Anne Gosling both 65 in 1901 who may well have been Ernest's grandparents.

At that time, I did nothing further but after the death of my wife I visited France with Jim South of Billinghay, who wished to visit his great uncle's grave. The cemetery is situated in the small hamlet of Amerval to the east of Cambrai. It is so small that it is not even mentioned in the index of the Michelin Road Atlas. To reach it means driving up a cart track followed by a section bone shaking section of paving and then up another cart track. It would only have been discovered by accident and I realised that the men buried there were for the most part forgotten. Incidentally, Charles South is buried next to Sidney A Sharpe who is commemorated on the Sleaford War Memorial.

The next spur was my neighbour Ray Ward whose Uncle Robert died on the Somme in July 1916. He asked me to take him to Thiepval where his Uncle is listed as one of the 73,000 missing men commemorated on the huge memorial there. As a Christmas present for him I produced a small booklet detailing the last hours of his uncle's life with the

7<sup>th</sup> Battalion, the Lincolnshire Regiment. On a subsequent visit I was able to walk him along the route his uncle took on his last day alive and into the field across which he made his last attack and was able to tell him that somewhere in the area over which he was looking his uncle had died. It was a very moving moment for both of us.

Only a few months a body was in a wood at the end of that very field and although it was not Ray's uncle, it was a same regiment and did at least confirm that what I had told him was in essence correct. Looking back, I think that was the moment when I made up my mind that the thirty-nine men and one woman whose names were inscribed on the Billinghay War Memorial deserved than just cold names carved in stone.

My first thought was simply to record some details before all memory of them faded. I knew that it would be a difficult as it was over eighty years since the end of the First World War and there would be little or no chance of finding anyone with first-hand knowledge of any of the names, but I was determined to find at least some details of all of them.

My starting point was the records of the Commonwealth War Graves and I did obtain a great deal of information there which then led to further inquiries. But I also came up against difficulties. The spellings of the names or the initials of the names recorded by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, on the War Memorial and on the Register of Service in the church were not always accurate. It took a certain amount of imagination and invention to track them down and even then, there was some doubt as to the correct versions. I am sure that as soon as I think I have the correct names someone will tell me something different.

I also found out that not all the men from the Parish were recorded and are on other memorials or were on no memorial but I decided to make my starting point the Register of Honour of all those who served in the First World War which hangs in the Parish church.

Another difficulty was that when even the older members of the community spoke to me about their relatives, I did not get a lot of information as it would seem that many of those who did return were very reluctant were very reluctant to talk about their experiences. It became that no one who had been in the fighting had been unchanged by the experience and that the anti- war sentiments in the thirties were probably a result of this. Furthermore, memories play strange tricks and some stories were told me that I subsequently found untrue but I have included them nevertheless with a qualifier as they may in fact have had some basis in fact.

The death rate was one in five of Billinghay men who served in World War One and it would seem that this village was unlucky as the average death rate through the British Army was one in eight. However, this was not the true cost. Hidden among the names of those who returned were further casualties. Bill Bailey lost the lower part of his right arm. Harold Hilton a great friend of Bill's, lost his left arm and never came to terms with his injury. He later hanged himself in one of the outbuildings of the Coach and Horses public house. Charles Creasey was gassed and discharged as medically unfit. Richard Bee the brother of Harold Bee had been a member of a Lewis Gun Team and was badly wounded in both forearms. He was in hospital for over a year unable to feed himself and, when he came home, wore a pair of leather gauntlets even in hot weather because due to bad circulation his arms and hands were always cold. He later received a disability pension of 7/6d (37.5p) per week.

When talking to my mother about this I also found out that my own great uncle Claude Randall MM, who I remember as a dapper little man had a hole in his left leg the size of an egg which never healed and he received treatment for until the day he died.

Joe Vickers brother of Walter Vickers (see below) was twice wounded but survived to work in Robinson's saddlers shop until well into his eighties. There may have been many others whose lives were irrevocably changed but whose stories will unfortunately remain untold.

There were many other pieces of information which people did not consider important but which all showed the experiences of war for the ordinary soldier. They come to light at odd times but I have had great difficulty in convincing people of their importance. For example, Jim South told me that Bill Bailey helped to carry wounded to the aid station even though his own left arm was shattered. He also refused to have his arm amputated in France but it was not until when, he was back in England he was told that if the operation were not performed that he would die, that he consented.

There was the story of John Harrod who was wounded and one of the stretcher bearers who collected him on the battlefield was Fred Skinns from the village of Walcott just down the road from Billinghay. There must have been many more which showed the experiences of the ordinary soldier and I would have liked to include them in this book but unfortunately have been lost forever.

The Billinghay War Memorial stands in the Market place on the site of the village pump. In 1905 preparations had been made to clean out the well. The job had almost been completed when at 3.45 a.m. on Sunday morning it collapsed leaving a hole in the road fifteen to twenty feet in diameter and six feet deep. The War Memorial was created on the site sometime in the early nineteen twenties.

The book started out as a pure compilation of facts but I realised it would be very dull if it were presented that way. It was Sue Pittendreigh who solved the problem when she suggested that I should make it form part of a short history of the two World Wars or at least the parts that concerned the Billinghay Boys. I am no historian but have done my best to write a short outline and hope I will be forgiven for any factual inaccuracies.

Please remember that this is meant as a tribute to the people of my village who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and also to all the those from villages around the world who were led to the slaughter.

The title of the book has an interesting history. When I attended the local Grammar School there were occasions when in the morning assembly when the Headmaster would announce "Would the Billinghay boys please stay behind." Usually this was because of some bad behaviour on the bus home the previous evening. The phrase became a catch phrase during riotous nights in the local public houses. I could think of no better title for this book. So here they are, and I am sure that Nurse Nellie Wilson would not mind being included, the Billinghay boys who did indeed stay behind.

The service is funded through donations and grant support and is free to older people. At the moment Age UK Lindsey are in contact with over 100 older people and every £10 donated will support a visit. We know the service makes a huge difference to the lives of those in contact with the service.

SO MUCH SO, WE THOUGHT IT WOULD GIVE OUR RESIDENTS CHANCE TO SEE HOW MUCH PRICES HAD CHANGED IN THE ENSUING TWENTY YEARS. RATHER THAN SPEND A LOT OF TIME RESEARCHING THE PRESENT-DAY COST, WE ARE LEAVING THIS FOR YOU TO PUT YOUR OWN FIGURES IN USING THE DIAGRAM BELOW:

# The Cost of Living in Billinghay in 1999

Commodities are measured in both metric and imperial measures. The integration from imperial to metric has been continuing since 1989. The integration period has now been extended a further ten years to allow businesses time to adjust. 
