COUNCIL NEWS

Billinghay Parish Council recently saw a change of membership with the resignation of Kathryn Locke, who has been a hard-working councillor and Chair of Parish Council.

Kathryn felt she was not unable to continue to give the time and commitment to the Parish Council, and so after giving much thought she has reluctantly left but added that she hoped to return at some time in the future.

At the April meeting of Parish Council, Cllr Wendy Liles was elected to the role until the position is filled at the May AGM, and opened the meeting by paying tribute to Kathryn's service to the local community. The completion of the Neighbourhood Plan with its impact on local planning was mainly brought about by Kathryn's determination to see it through. Councillors acknowledged Kathryn's dedication of time to many Parish Council projects and wished her well.

A representative leading arrangements for the Queens Platinum Jubilee celebrations attended the April meeting from Village Hall Committee and asked if the Parish Council could donate to cover the proposed costs for an event to be held on Saturday June 4 at the Village Hall and Playing Field.

The Parish Council were happy to support the event, having considered the costings and agreed unanimously to give £850.

The Parish Council still have a number of vacancies to fill by co-option and would welcome applications from younger members of the community. If you are over 18 we would like to hear from you. The addition of younger members of the Community would widen the range of views on the Council and, hopefully, ensure that matters affecting younger residents receive full consideration.

Serving the Parish Council is a great way of getting involved with local matters, to feel part of a team and with many training events offered without charge can help to improve knowledge of varied subjects.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Parish Council monthly meetings are currently being held in various locations in the village depending on availability and suitability.

Check the Parish notice boards to see where, if you wish to attend.

If you are aware of any issues around the village, have any suggestions for ways to improve village life, or would like to attend a meeting, please do not hesitate to contact the Parish Clerk.

You could also attend if you wished to consider joining the Council to find out what happens and the type of issues discussed.

PLANNING

Residents have shown interest in seeing what changes are planned for the village particularly by way of new developments or changes to existing properties. The Planning Department of North Kesteven District Council already take steps to notify residents that they think will be affected by any planning applications in accordance with the laid down guidelines.

In addition the Neighbourhood Plan included significant proposals that were adopted to ensure that development was in accordance with community wishes.

Even so the Parish Office does receive enquiries as to what is being planned and, to keep residents informed, we are listing in the Newsletter any new applications received since the previous issue. The Council do scrutinise each application and, where necessary, put in their own comments.

Fed up with problems such as potholes, broken paving slabs, street lighting and overgrown hedges?

If everyone who is affected also reported the problem direct to Lincolnshire County Council, the seriousness of the problem would be emphasised. The identity of the person reporting the problem can remain anonymous unless they choose to show their name.

Residents without computer access can still report problems via the Parish Council who will pass on details to Lincolnshire County Council. We will continue to do this but we can only register the complaint once. Numerous residents reporting the same problem will have a greater impact on prioritising problems.

Therefore, we would recommend that you use the system provided by the County Council and report the problems directly to them using the **Fix My Street system on the LCC website**.





Policing Priorities in the area

Priority

Speeding in rural villages has been highlighted from a resident poll

Action Taken:

Sleaford Neighbourhood Policing Team have been carrying out several speed checks in the local rural villages. We recently engaged in Project EDWARD (Every Day Without A Road Death) which saw several officers deployed across Lincolnshire's roads enforcing Fatal Four offences throughout the week of action. We continue to be in areas most affected and encourage the community to take part in Community Speed Watch.

PCSOs have the power to stop a mechanically propelled vehicle on a road and issue traffic offence reports under section 89 Road traffic regulations Act 1984.

Speeding in rural villages has been highlighted from a resident poll on the Nextdoor App and speeding was the main concern. PCSOS will be out at various times and days of the week carrying out speed checks and dealing with any offences.

Police must be overt when carrying out the checks and wear high visibility uniform.



WILL THE BILLINGHAY BOYS PLEASE STAY BEHIND

Mick Wright or "Wrighty" as he was known was a well known character in Billinghay and served as a hard working Councillor for Billinghay Parish Council.

Over a period of many years, Mick gave a lot of time to research the lives of Billinghay people who served in both World Wars It was a project that was very dear to him and provides an insight of interest to many local families. During this time he made trips to the battlefields to visit as many graves of the fallen as he could.

He had hoped to put his research into a book for publication but never felt it was fully complete. Unfortunately, Mick passed away before his work came to fruition. He did, however, pass copies of his research to the Parish Council and it is split into two volumes:

- A volume detailing the involvement of Billinghay people during the conflicts
- A volume giving details of individuals and the role they played

We felt that the years of hard work that had gone into production of this research were worthy of publication and we commenced this process in the January/February 2021 issue of the Newsletter. Specific individual details can be given to relations who may request them via the Parish Office. The next chapter is detailed below:

1918 Part Four

As I stated in the introduction, one of the catalysts for the writing of this book was **Charles L South**, Private 68263, 1st Battalion, Cheshire Regiment, who died on 23rd October 1918. Charles Leedale South was born on 8th December 1895 and was baptised on 5th January 1896 at Billinghay. He was the son of John Edward South, (1852-1929) a miller and his second wife, Sarah Eleanor (1857-1933). According to his nephew, Eric South and his great nephew, Jim South, Charles came home on leave just before the end of the war and on his last night was drinking in the Cross Keys with a local cobbler, Fred Dickinson. He was persuaded to stay for an extra drink, and as a result, missed his train back to France and was late re-joining his regiment. He met his regiment coming out of the line and made to join them but was ordered to the front to clean out the recently vacated trench. I was while undertaking this duty that he was killed by shellfire. A good story which does not seem to be 100% correct. Jim has obtained a copy of the regimental records and the regiment was not in the line at the time of his death or even just before it. However, it was common for regiments out of the line to provide working parties for the front and it is possible that Charles was indeed late back from leave and as a punishment was told to join such a working party. We shall never know. Charles was buried in Amerval Communal Cemetery Extension, Soslesmes, France. There is also a commemorative brass plate in Billinghay Parish Church, which reads as follows:

> IN TENDER LOVING MEMORY OF CHARLES LEEDALE SOUTH KILLED ON THE BATTLEFIELD IN FRANCE OCT 23RD 1918 AGED 22 YEARS Greater love hath no man than this, that a man Lay down his life for his friends

Only one person from the village died outside Europe and **Arthur Toulson** died a very long way from home. He was Private 20708, 2nd Battalion North Staffordshire Regiment and he died on 24th October 1918 October. Arthur was the son of Mrs Susan Toulson of Keys

Cottage, West Street, Billinghay. The name caused me some difficulty. I could find no record of William H Toulson in the Commonwealth War Graves Commission's records but did find a record to Arthur. I was unable to find anything more for some time until Barry Hall casually mentioned in the Coach and Horses that Mrs Edna Biggin of Park Lane had some postcards from Arthur and that the wrong name was on the War Memorial. William H was Arthur's brother and did indeed serve in the First World War, but he was not killed.

Mrs Biggin had about a dozen postcards from Arthur, but only five of them were written on. The first was undated and depicted a sailor on the deck of a ship in very heavy seas. The sailor had a monkey and a parrot. Arthur had written on the picture: The parrot is saying "Pretty Polly dressed in green, going to Blighty to see the Queen." And the monkey is saying "Stop the ship. Let's get out and walk." On the back he had written "This is how it was when we was coming across but I wish I had a chance of coming back. You look well if I brought a monkey and a parrot back with me."

The next one is dated July 25th 1917 and could well have been the first of a batch: "Dear mother and sister I rite these few lines to you all as it leaves me well up to sending these post cards and put them in your album an they views of Rawalpindi and I am going too get some of Muree when I go up to Muree that are good ones too I have a letter from our Albert but I didn't know he was out....."

The next ones are in a batch numbered 1,2, and 3 and were apparently sent together. Number 1 is dated July 25th 1917and he says "Dear mother and sister, just a few more lines that I am sending you these photographs of where we are now and keep them in your album while I come home because I shall frame them id I am lucky."

Number 2 continues "I have not had a letter since I have been here and let me know when you get my first letter from me, how are they all getting on remember me to them and I hope it will soon be all over. We about fed up of it and I will keep sending some views." And number 3: "So I think this is all from your son Arthur from India."

Xxxx Pte Arthur Toulson

20728 Pte D Co. North Staffs Regt

Huldane Muree Hills India

Unfortunately, Arthur never came home to put the postcards in an album. He is believed to have died of pneumonia and is commemorated on the Delhi Memorial (India Gate) India. Of the 13,300 commemorated by name on the memorial just over 1,000 lie in cemeteries to the west of the River Indus, where maintenance was not possible. The remainder died in the fighting on, or beyond, the Northwest Frontier and during the third Afghan War and have no known grave.

Thousands of miles away on the same day **Arthur Franklin**,23859, 6th Battalion South Wales Borderers, died. I believed that Arthur was the illegitimate son of Jane Franklin. He was born on 4th January 1890, baptised on 18th February and lived in Billingham Fen. Private Franklin was the husband of Emma Franklin of Moore's Yard, Lincoln Road, Horncastle. I am told that at one time the Franklins lived in a row of cottages, now demolished, which stood on the site of the Billinghay Pottery opposite the Community rooms. I am not certain that this is the correct Commonwealth War Graves entry, but he is a local person, so I am hopeful that it is the right one. It is almost certain that Arthur was a prisoner of war because he is buried in Niederzwehren Cemetery, Germany.

The Armistice came into force on 11th November 1918, but the losses to Billinghay did not end on that day. **William H Watson**, Private 133106, 74 Company, Machine Gun Corps died on Wednesday 13th November 1918 aged 20 years. William Henry was born on 13th December 1897(?) and baptised 13th January 1898. He was the son of Henry Edward, a butcher and Matilda Watson (nee Kennington) of Billinghay.

William was a member of the Machine Gun Corps and as such must have been above average fitness as the standard was much higher than for infantry due to the weight of the

equipment. He would have been trained at Belton Park, near Grantham, before being sent to France. His death certificate states that he died of influenza. His age on the death certificate is given as 22 years, which does not tie up with his actual age of 20 years and it is possible that he falsified his age to join up. He is listed as William A Watson in the Register of Honour in Billinghay Parish Church.

John King, Private 20166, 8th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on Thursday 28th November 1918. John Arthur King was born in May 1896 and baptised on 8th September 1896, the son of Mary Edith King, a single woman. Mary had a large family and many of the present-day residents of Billinghay are related to her. John King's Nephew, Doug, (now deceased) still lives in the village and he told me that his uncle died on the last day of the war. He was told that John got out of a trench and was walking towards a ruined house when he was shot by a sniper. He also told me that Clarence Harrod had more information, but unfortunately Clarence died before I could talk to him. The sniper part of the story is possibly true, although John did not die until 28th November, seventeen days after the end of the war. The History of the Lincolnshire Regiment 1914-1918 by Major General C R Simpson states that the 8th Battalion were not involved in any fighting at this time, although two platoons of D Company were attached to the 11th Brigade mopping up in some orchards and a railway crossing. The last casualties were on 4th November 1918. They were one officer and five other ranks killed and one officer and three other ranks wounded. It is possible that John was one of the wounded and died later. He is buried in Caudry British Cemetery, Nord, France.

The next day saw the death of another soldier who served in the same Battalion as John King. He was **George Chamberlain MM**, Private 19093, 8th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment. This is one of the saddest stories I have discovered. Henry Chamberlain, who was the nephew of George, told me that after the Armistice, on 27th November to be precise, Alf Chamberlain, George's father was so pleased that his son was safe that he went to a local pub to have a celebratory drink. Two days later, on 29th November, Private George Chamberlain died. I am told that he died in an unusual way. Henry told me that George and some companions were sitting in a ruined house smoking when one of them threw away a cigarette end which landed on a box of flares which exploded, killing several soldiers, including George. Henry also said that a man named Flatters, from Billinghay, was killed at the same time, although he is not named on the village memorial, and I can find no trace of him in the village. George is buried in Caudry Cemetery next to John King.

I had just written this when I happened to speak to another villager who mentioned George. He proceeded to tell me a different story of how George died. The story roughly approximated to the above with the following differences: - he told me that George was in a tent when some French soldiers threw some sort of explosive device into it for a joke and in the resulting fire or explosion George and someone named Flatters also died. He went on to say that Flatters concerned was the eldest of three brothers. He could not remember his first name but said that the two younger brothers were called Reg and Wilf and that Reg hated the French after this incident. There is certainly a mystery as I can find no record of anyone called Flatters serving in the Great War, although I do know that Reg and Wilf did live locally and there is still a Flatters family in the village. (Later research seems to indicate that the Flatters referred to was actually John King whose mother married John Flatters after his birth and he is listed on the 1911 census living with Reg and Wilf Flatters)

John Hildred was the last man from Billinghay to die in 1918. He was Corporal M2/191717, Royal Service Corps. He died on 27th December 1918 aged 19 years.

John Hildred was the son of George and Annie Hildred and the husband of Emily Maud Hildred of High Street and was born 1890/91. George Hildred was a motor mechanic, as was John at the time of his marriage. He married Emily Maud Marshall on 14th October 1913 at Billinghay. Emily was the daughter of Joseph Brand Marshall (1864-1942) and Elizabeth Ann Marshall (nee Wells). Emily was the great aunt of Ted Marshall who served on the Village Hall Committee and the Parish Council for many years. John was therefore Ted Marshall's uncle. John and Emily had a daughter, Annie Elizabeth, who married Bertie Green, a bus driver and smallholder (son of Robert Green) on 10th June 1939 at Billinghay. They were the parents of Pete Green who until recently had a smallholding in Anwick Fen.

Pete Green has told me that his grandfather died on a troopship which hit a mine while returning from France. However, the records state that John died in the 4th Northern General Hospital* in Lincoln, so it is possible that he was injured in the sinking and then transferred to Lincoln. His address at the time of his death was given as Bridge Street, Billinghay, but Pete Green remembers visiting his grandmother (John's wife) who lived in a row of cottages, now demolished, where the mobile Library now parks.

The last man to die, who served in the First World War was **Sydney G Atchinson**, Sapper 127986, Signal Coy, Royal Engineers. He died on 27th May 1920, aged 23 years. **Sydney Atchinson** was born circa 1896/7, the son of Charles Edward Atchinson (1856?7-1933) and Betsy Ann Atchinson (nee Bones 1856-1923). They were married on 11th June 1889 at Kyme. Charles was a Grocer and Postmaster at Billinghay Post Office.

Henry Chamberlain of Billinghay told me that Sydney was ill for a very long time and that he was at home for over a year a year before he died; but an obituary in a local paper and reproduced below would seem to suggest otherwise. (It is possible that Sydney died in the flu epidemic that followed the war).

"Another victim of has been claimed the Great War in Sydney Gilbert Atchinson, only son of Mr and Mrs C E Atchinson, the Post Office, Billinghay, who, after a long period of suffering passed away at the early age of 23 years. Deceased enlisted in the Royal Engineers in 1915 as a telegraphist. He was drafted to France, where he was on active service until the Armistice, afterwards serving with the Army of Occupation on the Rhine until June 1919, when an illness necessitated a serious operation. He was transferred to England last November and afterwards receiving treatment at two London hospitals. Was transferred to Lincoln County Hospital, finally arriving home about three weeks ago. It was hard to reconcile to reconcile his pale, drawn features with the sturdy, kindhearted lad who had joined the colours full of energy. Terrible though his suffering has been, he has borne it all with fortitude. Heartfelt sympathy is felt on all hands towards the sorrowing father, mother, and family. Educated at Christ Hospital Terrace and the Technical Schools, Lincoln, deceased has been extremely fond of all kinds of sports. The internment took place on Saturday, the last sad rites being performed by the Vicar, The Rev.C.W. Ambrose. The chief mourners were:- Mr and Mrs C E Atchinson (father and mother); Miss Atchinson (sister); Mr D Creasey (cousin): Mr and Mrs Frank Caswell (brother-in-law and sister): Mr and Mrs J G Mayfield (cousins); Mr Raymond Keeble (cousin); Mr Frank Ingram (army comrade); Mr Fred Gilbert (cousin); Mr Clack (Baptist Minister) and a number of friends and exsoldiers.

Frank Ingram later married Sydney's sister May Atchinson (1891-1961) on 14th August 1933 at Billinghay. Mrs Frank Caswell was Sydney's second sister Florence (1892). Sydney was buried in Billinghay Old Cemetery on 29th May 1920.

And so, the war to end all wars came to an End.

OBITUARY - LIZ WALTERS



We are all beginning to feel the impact of rising food, fuel and energy prices. Purses are being tightened by us all. Finding the extra money when times get tough is really hard and the attraction of a win on the lottery or a scratch card is every greater. A £5 gamble could change your life and make all those money worries disappear. But sadly its not always as simple as that. While it can be fun to daydream, there is an unfortunate dark side to winning that people don't often talk about.

It is hard for average people to wrap their minds around the fact that the majority of lottery winners end up going broke in a short period of time. A couple who won £1.8million on the National Lottery in 2005 both quit their jobs. The couple invested in property and a beauty salon but the financial crash saw the value of their portfolio plummet. By 2013 the money had gone and the couple had split up, each blaming each other for the reversal in their fortunes. Their story is not an isolated event, and it turns out that throwing a large sum of money into someone's lap does not suddenly change their fortunes. Their behaviours remain the same (or get worse), and they sometimes end up in a weaker financial position than they were before they ever won the lottery in the first place. The glitz and the glamour that the lottery promotes about its top prizes often turn into a nightmare when they play out in reality.

How can a person who is accustomed to dealing with nothing more than a week or two weeks' worth of salary suddenly find themselves managing sums that are equal to a lifetime or more worth of hard work? It is a stressful situation that sends many lottery winners over the edge. They have the competing impulses of wanting to spend lavishly on things that they could never afford before, while at the same time wanting to retain the money that they have made from the lottery. It is not easy to handle this level of responsibility for anyone, and it can cause some people to crack under the pressure. They experience negative outcomes with their mental health, and they have financial pressure that they never would have expected to deal with after winning such large sums. They end up with more problems on their hands than they had before they ever won the money.

Pinning your financial future to winning the lottery is entirely unrealistic. The odds against winning top prizes in the lottery are incredibly high, and the games themselves are designed to be net losers for the players (otherwise they would not exist). Thus, it is better to have a more realistic and well-thought-out plan for achieving your financial goals. Instead of taking the risks that the lottery poses to both winners and losers, you should consider planning for the future in a way that is sustainable and that can lead you to a place where you find yourself both mentally and financially stable.

At the time of writing, the visit is going ahead albeit with smaller numbers than in other years. The French "twinners" are revising the program of events and we do not know exactly what is being planned.


