PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS – 4TH MAY 2023

Billinghay Parish Council elections, along with North Kesteven District Council elections, will be held on 4th May 2023. The following gives some information on who can stand and how to stand as a Parish Councillor and who can vote at the elections. More detailed information can be found at the sites detailed at the end of the article.

VOTING AT THE ELECTION

Who can vote at a Parish Council election?

To vote at local elections you must be registered to vote within the parish and:

- be 18 or over on the day of the election "polling day."
- be a British, Irish, qualifying Commonwealth or EU citizen.
- be resident at an address in England or Wales.
- not be legally excluded from voting.

Voter ID requirement

From 4 May 2023, voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections. This will apply to:

- Local elections.
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections.
- UK parliamentary by-elections.
- Recall petitions.

From October 2023 it will also apply to UK General elections. If you don't have accepted photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a **Voter Authority Certificate**.

Accepted forms of photo ID

You can use any of the following accepted forms of photo ID when voting at a polling station.

International travel

• Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country.

Driving and Parking

- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence).
- A Blue Badge

Local travel

- Older Person's Bus Pass.
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass.
- Oyster 60+ Card.
- Freedom Pass.
- Scottish National Entitlement Card.
- 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card.
- Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card.
- Senior Smart Pass issued in Northern Ireland.
- Registered Blind Smart Pass or Blind Person's Smart Pass issued in Northern Ireland.
- War Disablement Smart Pass issued in Northern Ireland.
- 60+ Smart Pass issued in Northern Ireland.
- Half Fare Smart Pass issued in Northern Ireland.

Proof of age

• Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card).

Other government issued documents

- Biometric immigration document.
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card).
- National identity card issued by an EEA state.
- Electoral Identity Card issued in Northern Ireland.
- Voter Authority Certificate.
- Anonymous Elector's Document.

You will only need to show one form of photo ID. It needs to be the original version and not a photocopy.

Out of date photo ID

You can still use your photo ID if it's out of date, as long as it looks like you. The name on your ID should be the same name you used to register to vote. If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a **Voter Authority Certificate**, if:

- you don't have an accepted form of photo ID.
- you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you.
- you're worried about using an existing form of ID for any other reason, such as the use of a gender marker.
- You need to register to vote before applying for a Voter Authority Certificate.

How to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate

Apply online. You can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate on gov.uk.

Apply by post. You can also apply by filling out a paper application form and sending this to North Kesteven District Council (NKDC), contact details at end of this article. You can request the instructions in large print, braille or easy read. You may also be able to apply in person at NKDC. If you need any help with applying for a Voter Authority Certificate or want to request an application form, contact NKDC. You can also call the Electoral Commission helpline on 0800 328 0280 if you have any questions.

Information you will need to provide. When applying for a Voter Authority Certificate, you will need to provide your:

- name.
- address.
- date of birth.
- National Insurance number.

You should apply using the same name that you used to register to vote. You will not need to provide your gender, and your certificate will not have a gender marker.

If you don't know your National Insurance number or don't have one

You can find your National Insurance number on:

- Payslips
- official letters about tax, pensions or benefits

You can still apply if you don't know your National Insurance number, or don't have one. You will need to provide other forms of proof of identity, such as a birth certificate, bank statement and a utility bill. NKDC will contact you to arrange this. If you don't have any other accepted proof of identity, you can ask someone you know to confirm your identity. This is known as an attestation.

Providing a photograph

You will need to submit a photo with your application. The requirements for the photo

are similar to the requirements for a passport photo. **Processing your application**

NKDC will process your application. They will send the Voter Authority Certificate to you by post. They will also send you instructions on how to use your certificate. Voter Authority Certificates do not have an expiration date, but it's recommended that you renew your certificate after 10 years. All data you provide when applying for a certificate will be stored securely by NKDC, in line with data protection regulations.

STANDING FOR ELECTION AS PARISH COUNCILLOR

How is a Parish Councillor elected?

Councillors are elected using the First Past the Post system, where the candidates that receive the most votes are elected to fill the number of seats which are available. Electors will be able to vote for as many candidates as there are vacant seats – at normal elections this will be for all the councillor seats on the Parish Council. Billinghay Parish council has 11 seats.

If less candidates stand than the number of available seats these candidates will be elected as councillors without a vote having to take place. This is called an uncontested election and is quite common at scheduled Parish Council elections.

Who can stand for election as a Parish Councillor?

Any person who wishes to stand as a councillor must submit Parish Council nomination papers. These are available through the North Kesteven District Council website and come as a Parish Council Nomination Pack. This pack includes all the forms required for nomination and instructions for compilation.

The nomination forms have to be submitted as hard, original signed forms. Candidates wishing to stand for election must submit nomination papers to the Returning Officer at one of the following locations:

- Thursday 16 March to Tuesday 4 April (between 10am and 4pm, Monday to Friday) Meeting Room 1, North Kesteven District Council Offices, Kesteven Street, Sleaford NG34 7EF.
- Thursday 23 and Friday 24 March ONLY (between 10am and 4pm) NKDC Waste and Street Scene Depot, Scoley Court, Metheringham LN4 3BS.
- Thursday 30 and Friday 31 March ONLY (between 10am and 4pm) Info Links Office, ONE NK, Moor Lane, North Hykeham LN6 9AX.

To make an appointment to deliver nomination papers, please either:

- **email the Corporate and Civic Support team**, giving your name, contact details, number of nomination papers to be submitted and for which parish or
- phone either 01529 308208 or 01529 308209 during office hours only.

Priority will be given to those who have made an appointment. If you do not, you may have to wait to be seen.

Delivery of the nomination paper, home address form and consent to nomination MUST be by hand and can be by the candidate or their representative. Whilst the other necessary documents may be sent by post it is desirable for all documentation to be delivered with the nomination paper.

Anyone considering standing as a candidate or an agent is strongly advised to read guidance and information provided by the Electoral Commission.

Qualifications for standing as a candidate

To be able to stand as a candidate at a Parish Council election in England and Wales you must:

- be at least 18 years old on the day of your nomination.
- be a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any other member state of the European Union.
- meet at least one of the following four qualifications:
 - 1. You are, and will continue to be, registered as a local government elector for the parish in which you wish to stand from the day of your nomination onwards.
 - 2. You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.
 - 3. Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish.
 - 4. You have lived in the parish or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.

Disqualifications from standing as a candidate

Apart from meeting the qualifications for standing for election, you must also not be disqualified from standing. There are certain people who are disqualified from being elected to a Parish Council in England.

You cannot be a candidate if at the time of your nomination and on the day of the election:

• You are employed by the Parish Council or hold a paid office under the Parish

Council.

- You are the subject of a bankruptcy restrictions order or interim order.
- You have been sentenced to a term of imprisonment of three months or more (including a suspended sentence), without the option of a fine, during the five years before polling day.
- You have been disqualified under the Representation of the People Act 1983 (which covers corrupt or illegal electoral practices).

You are subject to the notification requirement of or under Part 2 of the Sexual Offences Act 2003, and the ordinary period allowed for making an appeal or application in respect of the order or notification has passed.

RIPARIAN OWNERSHIP PROJECT.

If you own land with a watercourse running through it, along its boundaries or under it, you have certain rights and responsibilities that in legal terms make you a 'riparian owner'.

To help raise awareness of riparian rights and responsibilities, we're working with Billinghay Parish Council as part of the Lincolnshire Riparian Project.

Being a riparian owner is an important role; one that helps to protect your own property, that of neighbours, and those upstream. This means ensuring water can flow freely without being blocked.

This doesn't just include all rivers and streams, it also applies to drainage ditches and any watercourse, regardless of size, above or below the ground. Maintaining them properly can play a crucial role In managing flood risk locally and across Lincolnshire.

If you would like more information about your potential rights and responsibilities, the Joint Lincolnshire Flood Risk and Water Management Partnership will be hosting an information event on riparian ownership as apart of the Annual Parish Meeting on 15 May 2023 at Billinghay Village Hall, Ringmoor Close, Billinghay, LN4 4EX.

In addition to the above there will also be ample opportunity to raise any other flooding concerns that you might have.

FIX MY STREET



Fed up with problems such as potholes, broken paving slabs, street lighting and overgrown hedges?

If everyone who is affected also reported the problem direct to Lincolnshire County Council, the seriousness of the problem would be emphasised. The identity of the person reporting the problem can remain anonymous unless they choose to show their name.

Residents without computer access can still report problems via the Parish Council who will pass on details to Lincolnshire County Council. We will continue to do this but we can only register the complaint once. Numerous residents reporting the same problem will have a greater impact on prioritising problems.

Therefore, we would recommend that you use the system provided by the County Council and report the problems directly to them using the **Fix My Street system on the LCC website**.

A WALK THROUGH THE PAST IN BILLINGHAY

Some time ago NKDC published a booklet about the history of Billinghay by way of a map showing a walk around the older part of the village. Since then, there has been a substantial increase in the number of residents due the housing developments.

To enlighten newcomers and refresh the memories of long-standing residents, we intend retelling the facts in the Billinghay News, updating where necessary. A lot of the information regarding village "characters" is displayed on the Zoetropes to be found around the old village. We apologise for the blatant plagiarism and hope that you enjoy reading about the Billinghay past.

Below is a map of the village with a couple of the old buildings detailed also.



As you approach Billinghay, it's position, tucked away defensively behind the Skirth waterway and guarded by its two bridges, is a reminder of its waterlogged past. In the winter months it was a gravelled island surrounded by water for the marshland and low – lying fens surrounding the village were almost perpetually flooded. It was sealed in by the Skirth to the South and the Roman Car Dyke to the East, while Northern access was impeded by the often-flooded Walcott Hollows which are said to be haunted by a ghost, "Meg of the Hollows". She was certainly in possession of a lantern, but less surely in possession of her head and young farm workers would scurry home at dusk for fear of meeting her.

The Settlement was first mentioned in the Domesday Book, although it is believed to date back to Roman times. In the North of the village workmen discovered a shallow grave and accidentally destroyed the skeleton and small vase which lay there. However, nine more Roman skeletons were unearthed alongside three more small vases, the tallest being 5 inches high.

Billinghay's isolation gave it a fierce independence which could border on savagery and unwary visitors were rumoured to disappear with slit throats into the marshes which gave Billinghay it's rich living. There was an abundance of fish and wildfowl, and this, hand in hand with summer grazing for sheep and cattle on the flood pastures, gave Billinghay a comfortable enough existence for the villagers to fight hard to maintain it. There are still bitter memories of the seventeenth century drainage of the fens which changed Billinghay so radically and these memories, alongside with those of conflict with Royalist Digby during Billinghay's Roundhead past, still lead to slightly uneasy relationships between Billinghay and its surrounding villages.

As you cross the bridge into the village you can see the vantage point of the famed "Billinghay Roughs" who used to congregate on the bridge and guard the entrance to the village. The Roughs were made up of people like Nickel Bavin - (whose work included clearing out the drains with the "slough" a shovel made of willow because the thick blue Billinghay clay sticks to metal) Enoch Bailey, Torsey Ned Pearson, (foreman of the drainage gang which worked on mending the banks and "cradging" the dykes to keep the waterways clear and who died one winter in the cold waters of the Skirth) and Compo (for the number of compensation claims he made) Bill Bailey.

Their build was as memorable as their names for they are remembered as tall and heavily built, tipping the scales at an average of fifteen or sixteen stones. They were a physical bunch too, quick tempered and ready to use their fists though Billinghay seems to have regarded them with a tolerant near-affection and, unlike today's gangs, the Roughs were regarded as village guardians rather than as a threat to the local residents. Any aggression which was not discharged amongst themselves or on their long-suffering wives was channelled into warding off outsiders who were foolish enough to come courting Billinghay girls.

Times continue to be challenging for many people but there is help out there if you know where to look, so in this issue I am providing some details on the little known Government 'Help to Save' Scheme.

This Scheme is available to those on Working Tax Credits or Universal Credit and your take home pay is £658.64 or more in your last assessment.

In the Scheme you can save between £1 and £50 a month (but you do not have to pay in every month). You can also pay in as many times as you like in a month, as long as you do not exceed the £50 limit.

You can also withdraw monies from the account or stop any regular payments you have started to make, without any penalty.

At the end of 2 years you receive a bonus equal to 50% of the highest balance of the account. This bonus is paid even if you have withdrawn money from the account.

As an example if you save £20 per month for a year the balance will be £240. If you then withdraw £40 and never add any more to it, at the end of 2 years you will receive \pounds 120 bonus (50% of the £240 balance).

At the end of 4 years they review the highest balance again and if the new bonus is greater than any bonus already paid you will get a further bonus. The most you can receive as a bonus is therefore £1200. At the end of 4 years the account is closed and you cannot open another account.

Care is needed as your savings can affect your claim for benefits so please review the information from HMRC before setting up any account.

"Hello all, Happy New Year to you all. I was wondering if we could put something in the Billinghay Times about the increase in litter and dog poo around the field footpaths? I and a few others have done litter picks but it is impossible to keep up with the problem caused by these antisocial and mindless people. It is very disheartening seeing so many cans, food wrappers and general litter in the fields, ditches and hedgerows, causing damage to wildlife and the environment. It seems this has got worse lately particularly in some areas. Also there has been a definite increase in people leaving dog waste on the field footpaths and on the playing field. Dog poo bags are cheap and are in all the shops including the Co-op so there is no excuse. If this request reaches anyone responsible for dog poo or litter please be mindful of the damage you are causing to our countryside and remember that other people walk where you leave your waste. "
