GRANT APPLICATIONS

Billinghay Parish Council has a small budget for the award of grants to local Organisations. The amount budgeted sets the limit for the total of any awards. If there are successful applications which exceed the total amount, awards may be given proportionately.

The Council can only award grants in accordance with its legal powers. Any application received must clearly show benefit to some or all of the parish residents or some or all of the parish area. In addition, the benefit obtained must be commensurate with the expenditure incurred.

Grants will be considered at the Parish Council Finance meeting on the **20th November 2023** and every grant must meet the Council's grant criteria. More details regarding this are shown on the Application Form.

The Grant request must be submitted on the Billinghay Parish Council Application for Small Grants Form. Copies of the application form can be requested from the Parish Council Office or downloaded from the Billinghay Parish Council website (Policy and Procedures Section).

All applications must be accompanied by appropriate accounts and or supporting financial information (such as estimates for equipment or work to be undertaken).

Forms and the supporting information must be returned to the Parish Office by the 30 September 2023 so that Councillors have sufficient time to consider each application.

COUNCIL NEWS

Following representations from several residents, the Council agreed to publish salient points from Council Meetings in the Newsletter. This will only be done when the Minutes have been approved (i.e. at the following month's meeting. Full copies of the Minutes are available on the Parish Council website https://billinghay.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk after they are approved.

Looking at the most recent minutes, we feel that following topics are items that some residents would find of interest:

Other Planning Issues

The Council conducted a review of the proposed developments of bio-diversity plants at Martin Moor & Walcott Farm. It was felt that these needed to be looked at together as the main impact on Billinghay was considered to be the anticipated increase in HGV traffic through our village. A work group has been established to look at these developments and a preliminary meeting has been held with one of the developer's agents. Whilst this was informative, no action can be taken until actual applications are submitted. The matter will be scrutinised carefully when this happens.

Speed Indicator Devices (SID)

A second SID has been purchased so that we can cover more locations. We are now able to extract statistics from the SIDs and it has been agreed to publish these in the Newsletter (see page 7 of this issue). Currently, they are both located on Walcott Road. It is hoped eventually to provide the facility to use one of the SIDs on Mill Lane/Causeway Road. However, this requires consultation with the Road Safety Partnership to agree the best location. They have suggested a decision be delayed until the extent of the housing development is known as this may impact on the agreed speed limits in the area. The cost of the provision and erection of the supporting posts for the SIDs is quite expensive and we do not want to select the wrong position.

Highways

There are always issues concerning this subject and Councillors do their best to report matters to the Highways Department. This does not always bring about immediate results. Again we would encourage residents to report matters on the FIX MY STREET website even if it has already been recorded. The volume of reports may impact on the priorities that are given.

Several residents and Councillors have reported problems with footpaths within the village and beyond. Mention was made of the state of the Cycle Path between Billinghay and Walcott which was rendered difficult to use when the road was resurfaced as excess

grit had been thrown onto the path. The footpath problem is a priority and a meeting has been arranged with our County Councillor and an Official from Highways to inspect problem areas with Councillors and a local resident who has complained about them.

Defibrillators

Most of the village is well served with defibrillators but the developments around Mill Lane have meant that another one in that vicinity would be desirable. The Council have been able to economically purchase another machine via the London Hearts Charity and have recently received permission from LCC to attach this to the outer wall of the Fire Station. We are now obtaining quotes from approved Contractors so that the installation can be carried out.

Parish Clerk

With the Parish Clerk leaving, the position is now vacant and applications from suitable candidates will be welcomed.

Audits

The Council's Internal Audit has been concluded without any problems and the relevant forms have been submitted to the Government appointed external auditors.

Village Signs

Several residents had reported that the village sign on the Walcott Road that had been removed during the cycle path construction had not been replaced. In addition, it was suggested that there should also be a sign on the Causeway/ Mill Lane Road. We have contacted the LCC and are awaiting their response.

Riparian Project



We do know that some residents have formed their own litter picking groups in areas not covered by the Parish Street Cleaner. With this in mind we were able to obtain 8 litter picking kits from LCC free of charge. We have already distributed some of these to groups of which we were aware. We still have a few left if you have or want to form your own voluntary group. Please collect from the Parish Office.

SPEED INDICATOR DEVICES



The Parish Council has now purchased a second Speed Indicating Device and there is now one situated at the Walcott end of the village and one on Walcott Road, near to the junction of Shire Close.

So what do we hope to gain from these devices. Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs) are not punitive – they are informative and preventive. By confronting the motorist with the display of their speeding, immediate and lasting speed reductions of 25% on average are obtained. Also, the traffic statistics that are recorded allow the council to judge their effectiveness. However, a major complaint throughout the village is the speed of the traffic that passes through. The data collected allows the collection of statistics that could be used to support potential solutions to this issue, as well as possibly providing the evidence to justify any action.

You will have noticed that the devices are periodically rotated. It is a known fact that after a period of time, anything left in one place becomes familiar and less effective. So you may notice not only a rotation of the devices but periods of time where they appear to be switched off. These actions are necessary for the data that is collected to be accurate and more meaningfully analysed, and the signs to remain visually effective.

From 13th May to 7th August the device was located up from the Field Road junction, facing traffic entering the village from Walcott. Whilst visual to the traffic entering the village, a look in your rear view mirror as you pass the device will also show you your speed as you drive away from it. The data recorded is in both directions. The basic statistics for the period are as follows:

	From Walcott	To Walcott
Average speed:	28.99 mph	33.95 mph
Number of vehicles over period:	176,760	161,364
Percentage of vehicles doing 30 mph or less:	72.6%	38%

The maximum speed recorded has not been published as we do not want to encourage anyone to think this is a target to be beaten. Some of the speeds recorded were extremely concerning and showed a complete disregard by the drivers for the risks their dangerous driving presented. Those above 40 mph accounted for 4.77% (or 8431 vehicles) from Walcott and 14.81% (or 23,898 vehicles) going to Walcott. This demonstrates the known fact that vehicles are accelerating over the speed limit out of the village whilst still in the 30mph zone.

A resident recently took it upon themselves to rotate a device after it had been reset by the council. Hopefully, the explanation above explains why this is short sighted and will hamper the effectiveness of the devices in the longer term. It also risks damage to the expensive devices. **Please do not tamper with or move these devices.**





FIX MY STREET



Fed up with problems such as potholes, broken paving slabs, street lighting and overgrown hedges?

If everyone who is affected also reported the problem direct to Lincolnshire County Council, the seriousness of the problem would be emphasised. The identity of the person reporting the problem can remain anonymous unless they choose to show their name.

Residents without computer access can still report problems via the Parish Council who will pass on details to Lincolnshire County Council. We will continue to do this but we can only register the complaint once. Numerous residents reporting the same problem will have a greater impact on prioritising problems.

Therefore, we would recommend that you use the system provided by the County Council and report the problems directly to them using the **Fix My Street system on the LCC website.**

A WALK THROUGH THE PAST IN BILLINGHAY (Continued from the last issue)

The Community Rooms, formerly the Church Hall, nestling alongside St Michael's church is a characterful building, built by local contractor Mr Joseph Clarke and opened and dedicated by the Bishop of Lincoln on 3rd October 1924. It is built of bricks, brought in by steam wagon from the London Brick Company, and cement and red tiles and measures fifty by twenty feet. There is a small porch, kitchen, and toilets in addition to the main hall. It represents the sort of core building which all villages need – it was the meeting place for Cubs and Brownies and all sorts of local events and activities were conducted there. The chairs were purchased through the generosity of local subscribers and a piano was donated by the Reverend W.C. Ambrose.

In the centre of the village, where Church Street meets the junction of Bridge Street and Victoria Street is the War Memorial. It was erected on the site of the old village pump, once the gathering place of the local women before the days of piped water to every home.

Facing the War Memorial there used to be a long-established store which was a drapers and haberdashers to the village. Also in Victoria Street, on the right-hand side, and again almost opposite the War Memorial is the Old Cross Keys Inn, whose last landlord, Horace Ingermall, stopped trading around 1948. This pub has since been converted for private residence, like so many of the old public houses in Billinghay, is a sign of increased mobility and a lessening of dependence on the village.

On 9th September 1864, following two dry summers, much of Billinghay was consumed in a disastrous fire which destroyed many houses in an area extending from High Street down King Street across Victoria Street and over into West Street. As a result, much of Billinghay's architectural character in the area beyond the Church is predominantly Victorian.

However, just beyond the Cross Keys is the Manor House, an attractive property dating from the early 1800s. The house along side it, number 14, is another fine house which dates from 1791. Mr Carl Willows once lived in the house. In 1932 he won a cup for growing sugar beet. Just beyond the front garden wall is a mounting block, a reminder of the past when the horse was the main means of locomotion. Ladies used the block to mount side – saddle, whilst farmers, possibly emerging from the Cross Keys Inn somewhat the worse for drink, occasionally needed some assistance to remount. Folklore has it that a corpse was once discovered curled up in the hollow underneath the block.

Facing these properties is the Victoria Street Wesleyan Chapel, an imposing building in pale lemony grey brick, proclaiming its importance with its high windows and enormous doors. Methodism in Billinghay dated from the 1790s when Thomas Kent was given a licence to hold religious services in his home. Thomas Fawcett was a pioneering supporter of Methodism in the Sleaford area and in 1817 he built a small chapel in Billinghay and charged a tiny rental for it; unfortunately, the Methodists were summarily deprived of their chapel on Fawcett's death in 1831.and once more were in the uncomfortable position of being without a Chapel. Thomas Kent's son, William, gave some land in Victoria Street in 1832.and a chapel was opened, though it was structurally poor and was eventually destroyed in Billinghay's great fire.

In 1869 the present chapel was built on the same site. The foundations were laid on

15th June and the grand opening, performed by John James of Hull was held on 18th January 1870. After the ceremony 400 people sat down to a tea and there was also a general holiday as all the local shops closed. The Stamford Mercury said that the chapel "externally lays no claim to any strict style of architecture but is throughout gracefully attractive, void of all ostentatious ornamentation or extravagant ideas. Internally it is equally effective, chaste in its decoration, light and unique in general appearance."

During the next forty or so years Billinghay was part of the great heyday of Methodism and congregations were large and enthusiastic. Chapel was a focus of many activities – The Band of Hope, Youth Club, Sunday School and Concert Parties and Temperance Parades.

A little further on, on the opposite side of the road is Forge Cottage, which was Mr Grocock's blacksmiths. A bricked-up archway in the house frontage marks the entrance to the old forge. Children loved to watch the sparks fly as he hammered the hot iron and would cluster around as he worked away at shoeing horses, putting rims on cart and wagon wheels and making and repairing farm implements. The Grococks' grandson, Rob, lived with them in Forge Cottage and, after training as a lather boy with barbers in Collingham and Billinghay, at the age of 16 he set up a barber's shop in a room there. He also sold sweets and shoelaces and his first week's takings were seventeen shillings. On the urging of his sister, who worked in the shoe trade, he diversified into selling boots and shoes, until eventually he had a general store and shoe shop, selling boots and shoes at twenty-five and thirty shillings a pair, alongside his barbers' business.

Along with Sid Palmer, Jim Willows and Ted Olive, Rob Grocock was an active member of the Billinghay Male Voice Quartet which was formed about 1920 and made a name around the county singing at chapels, churches and halls for charity.

The Post Office used to be on the site of the present takeaway food outlet. It was run by Mr Atchinson and then by his daughter May. In 1931, she took over the Post Office from her father, who had been Postmaster there since the beginning of the century. At that time Billinghay's post came from Lincoln to Tattershall Railway Station. It was then collected in a pony and trap and brought to the village for sorting.

The Post Office was also a telephone exchange. Before the telephone came into use by the public, urgent messages were passed by telegraph to the Post Office and delivered by telegraph Boys. In rural areas boys could not be spared from the land and girls, like Mrs Phyillis Brighton, were employed as Telegraph Boys instead, .

She was born in1902 and worked as a "Telegraph Boy" from the age of 13 to 16 working from 7am to 7pm for six days a week for 2/6d a week, with unpaid overtime if s message came near 7pm as it had to be delivered that day. Her "round" by bicycle covered a large area from Timberland to South Kyme and Chapel Hill and had to be taken whatever the weather even carrying the bicycle through deep snow if necessary.

SLEAFORD RURAL NORTH

Sleaford Neighbourhood Policing Team

Our ambition is to provide a neighbourhood policing service of which you, and we, can be proud. Prevention will be at the heart of our work, through well-informed collaborative problem-solving, building participation and strengthening the communities we serve. We will remain part of those communities, known and accessible to you, and policing in a way that both prevents harm and enhances your trust in us.

Our approach is shaped by five key themes: accessibility, prevention, relationships, vulnerability, relationships and partnerships. These will underpin all areas of our service and form the basis of our neighbourhood policing offer.

Priority (July 2023)

Vehicle related Anti-Social Behaviour.

Action taken:

Modified / loud vehicles being driven inconsiderately will be the focus for the next period as we continue to receive reports of nuisance affecting safety and quality of life for residents. Targeting of known hotspots with a view to educate, explain and take enforcement action where necessary.






