

FIX MY STREET



Fed up with problems such as potholes, broken paving slabs, street lighting and overgrown hedges?

If everyone who is affected also reported the problem direct to Lincolnshire County Council, the seriousness of the problem would be emphasised. The identity of the person reporting the problem can remain anonymous unless they choose to show their name.

Residents without computer access can still report problems via the Parish Council who will pass on details to Lincolnshire County Council. We will continue to do this but we can only register the complaint once. Numerous residents reporting the same problem will have a greater impact on prioritising problems.

Therefore, we would recommend that you use the system provided by the County Council and report the problems directly to them using the **Fix My Street system on the LCC website.**

A WALK THROUGH THE PAST IN BILLINGHAY (Continued from the last issue)

Facing the Chapel is number 65, Laburnum House, an attractive and substantial private house. With its stone walls up to two feet thick in places, it is reputed to be the oldest house in Billinghay.

The Twells Motor Showroom was once was once the location of the great magnet, of the inter-war years, the "Cosy Cinema", which was a timber, corrugated iron and zinc structure built by William Preston from late 1920 to the end of 1921. The Cinema was built for about £300 and was a joint venture between Carl Willows, Fred Twells and John Underwood.



The Cinema lighting and projector were powered by a temperamental paraffin engine which had to be lit with a blow lamp. Bam Hunt, who had the bicycle shop in King Street, was the engine man. He had his work cut out and the frequent mechanical breakdowns led to a chorus of hisses and boos and the stamping of feet from the irate audience. Norman Farbon, son of James Farbon the butcher, played suitable music during the era of the silent films. For the first few months the cinema opened every evening showing two or three different pictures a week but opening eventually settled down to Thursday and Saturday evenings.

In the early 1930s the Cinema was bought by a Mr and Mrs Preece, but they couldn't make a living from it. So it was sold to Star Cinemas of Leeds, who owned a number of small cinemas, including Sleaford's. Mr and Mrs Bramer were the managers, with Mr Frederick Whittaker who was engaged in 1931 to stand outside in a smart red and brown dress uniform. Audiences saw the silent movie stars like Buster Keaton and

Charlie Chaplin flickering across the screen, to the tinkling accompaniment of the pianist, Harold Borrows, who worked there until the "talkies" were introduced.

At the Box Office adults paid 6d to 9d a seat and children, who sat at the front on forms, 2d or 3d to Mrs Bramer, the projectionist's wife. Audiences used to keep a few pennies back to buy refreshments from the usherette who walked with a tray round her neck selling cholate bars for 1d, ice cream for 2d and chips at 3d a bag. Saturday mornings there were special 3d matinees for the children, who watched serials with open mouthed attention.

Never a great money-making venture, Billinghay's cinema shared in the declining popularity of film-going in the post war years and the cinema finally closed its doors in 1959.

Ted Twells bought the cinema in 1958 and started selling Ferguson tractors at £325 a time. In 1964 his son, John, influenced the changeover from farm tractors to cars and by 1968 it was cars only, selling second hand models and offering a repair service. In 1970 the original cinema was converted to a showroom when Twells arranged a franchise with British Leyland, switching in 1977 to Vauxhall.

Charles Benton's Forge used to occupy the projecting house facing the site of the old Cinema. He came from a farming family, but his father set him up with a forge as he "could not take to farming. However, he was also known for his reluctant smithying, and his children often used to fetch him out of the pub for his lunch if he was not at the shop. They also used to have to go and blow the bellows for him before they went to school in the morning as the yard would already be full of horses waiting to be shod.

There was a saddlery on the east side of the High Street. In 1912 the business was taken on by Mr Hansord, who moved into the shop with his wife Florence Markham. Mr Hansord stayed in the business till his death in 1950, working all hours. As well as horse collars and saddles, binder canvasses for the old reapers were repaired. In the summer Mr Hansord went by pony and trap to carry out repairs on farms.





How to use the children centres' directories

Find a children centre

Go to www.lincolnshire.gov.uk_childrenscentres

To find a particular children centre use the search box and enter the name of the centre in the Keywords field. There is no need to enter the post code.

Each record has contact and location information and an outline of the services. There are links from the records to:

- the centre's Facebook page
 - the form to jain the centre
- the current timetable directory

Timetable directories

The timetable directory will change according to the school year. We have timetable directories for:

- term-time
- half-term
- the three main holidays Easter, Summer and Christmas

Searching in a timetable directory

You can use the search page to look for:

- the name of any children centre to see what events they are holding
 - the name of any session or activity, wherever it is being held

To find the search once you are on a children's centre page, click the previous link (as highlighted) in the black crumb trail at the top of the screen:



To search, enter a word (in this example, sensory room) into the Keywords field and click Search.

You will then see a clickable list of children centres where the word is mentioned.

When you have clicked on a children's centre, to quickly find the same word on the page press Ctrl F and enter the word into the search bar. It will then be highlighted on the page.

The Saturday timetable is the same for all children centres. Families may decide to visit another location at weekends, so all sessions are shown without needing to search.

How to print

To print a timetable, use your browser. Please be aware that printed timetables can soon become out of date as the directory may be updated at any time.

Look in the top right corner of your screen:

- for Microsoft Edge users select
 - for Google Chrome users select

You should then see the option to Print.

How to translate

Scroll to the bottom of any page and select 'Translation'. You will then go to a page where you can select the language. Once you have chosen the language you will be on the county council home

Do not use the search bar as that will cancel the translation. To see the directories, scroll down and select 'Childcare and family support', then the second yellow button, 'Find a children's centre'.

Everything will be in the chosen language as you navigate until you cancel or use the search.


