OTHER COUNCIL NEWS

To keep residents informed, we are publishing details of salient points arising from Council meetings and other work that may be undertaken. Certain issues detailed in the Minutes of meetings can only be released when the Minutes are approved (usually the following meeting). New Councillor

The Council are delighted to announce that Luke Mitchell has joined the Council. Any other persons wishing to help in this capacity would be welcome. We still have vacancies for three more Councillors. Full details of the co-option process are detailed on our website.

Conservation

NKDC have a new Conservation Officer, Matthew Bentley, who will be reviewing the current areas/buildings within the NKDC control. It has been agreed that Billinghay would be involved as part of the Neighbourhood Planning Review.

Cemetery Fees and Procedures

The Council's policy has been reviewed and changes made to:

- Ensure our fees are adequate and commensurate with other parishes in the area.
- Our procedures comply with he latest legislation.

Citizens Advice Bureau

The Council recently gave a donation to the CAB whose workload has increased during the recent pandemic and economic difficulties. It has been agreed that the CAB will attend a meeting open to the public to explain how they can help. It is hoped to arrange this for the Annual Parish Meeting in May,

Notice Boards

Residents have commented on the state of the notice boards around the village and it is hoped, weather permitting, to renovate these in the near future.

Budgets/Precept

The Council have agreed their budget for the coming financial year and requested a Pecept in accordance with this.

Parish Council Engagement

The Council were represented at a meeting to receive a report from Police Authorities on actions being taken to reduce crime etc. in the NKDC and SKDC areas. These included the undernoted:

- The rise in County Lines drug trafficking activities whereby suppliers are targeting more rural areas.
- The increase in rural theft is also being investigated
- Shoplifting is also an increasing problem and it was reported that Shops were now working together and sharing information, and preventative measures in an effort to combat the problem.
- There has again been a rise in anti-social behaviour particularly in the younger generation

Welcome! We are now half way through another academic year at school.

Our Year 5/6 pupils have just taken part in Bikeability. This is cycle training and all achieved a Level 2 pass. Well done to all pupils who took part in this.

Our Y3/4 pupils are going on their residential visit to Rand Farm Park after the half term holiday. We have a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) challenge for some of our pupils in March, where they will be designing rockets.



FIX MY STREET



Fed up with problems such as potholes, broken paving slabs, street lighting and overgrown hedges?

If everyone who is affected also reported the problem direct to Lincolnshire County Council, the seriousness of the problem would be emphasised. The identity of the person reporting the problem can remain anonymous unless they choose to show their name.

Residents without computer access can still report problems via the Parish Council who will pass on details to Lincolnshire County Council. We will continue to do this but we can only register the complaint once. Numerous residents reporting the same problem will have a greater impact on prioritising problems.

Therefore, we would recommend that you use the system provided by the County Council and report the problems directly to them using the **Fix My Street system on the LCC website**.

A WALK THROUGH THE PAST IN BILLINGHAY (Continued from the last issue)

At 45 High Street stood creeper hung Gordon House (since demolished), which became the Doctor's House when Blair House was vacated. Before that, the house belonged to a veterinary surgeon, Mr Arthur Gresswell, who, amongst other things, offered a fully comprehensive service examining horses "before and after purchase".



He became obsessed with the notion that that there was buried treasure in the garden. As a result, Billinghay had a miniature "Gold Rush in 1930 when Mr Gresswell claimed that a clairvoyant, he had just consulted had echoed the quite separate prediction he had received from a different mystic twenty years or so earlier. Four different mineral diviners all confirmed the presence of gold and Mr Gresswell was so convinced that he was quite literally sitting on a goldmine that he that he negotiated with a firm to sink a twenty-five-foot shaft. The Daily Mail published a breathless account of the treasure hunt, but eventually the hapless vet had to abandon the search though, curiously enough, it is claimed that minute particles of gold were discovered there.

Number 43 was once Osbournby's butcher's shop, a fine bow windowed building which is protected by a preservation order. It was once the location of Mrs Wells' store in which she sold clothing, haberdashery and lengths of material for home dressmaking.

There were three butcher's shops at the turn of the 19th/20th centuries Farbons, Ashbys and Haws. The shop opposite Osbournbys was the site of Albert Haws butchers' business and slaughterhouse. Haws practice was typical of butchers in the village. Meat

could not have been fresher as the animals were slaughtered at the rear of the shop.

Number 20 on the corner of High Street and Queen Street is the site of The Ship Inn, one of eight of public houses until the early years of the early years of 20th century. Mr and Mrs Palmer took it over in the late 1880s when it was still a free house.



The old Brew House was still in existence but was derelict. As Mr Palmer had been a farmer, it's doubtful if he would have known how to brew beer. The building was much smaller then. Its main door was across the corner, and this led into the bar – called "The Dram Shop". A second door in Queen Street led to a very small room called the Snug. It was here that the women could go with their jugs to buy beer for the family meals. They wouldn't have dreamt of going into a pub. A third door led into another room which was used by Lloyds as a Branch Bank on Thursdays until they moved to new premises in Victoria Street. Sadly, this has now closed and there are now no Banks in Billinghay, although the Post Office situated in the Co-op does provide some services which the Bank used to perform.

In the present car park of the Ship there was a large horse chestnut tree with a wooden seat fixed around the trunk, where the patrons could sit out in good weather and drink their beer. Even in the 1920s half a pint of mild beer, 5 Woodbines and a box of matches only cost five and a half pence, giving a halfpenny from a sixpence (6d) which equates to two and a half pence in our decimal currency. When the building was enlarged of course this tree had to go.

The Ship had four or five wells, one under the kitchen which was brick lined and was never known to run dry, even in a long hot summer. The water was pumped up into the kitchen, into a stone sink. After Mr Palmer's death in the early 1900s, Mrs Palmer married a Mr Taylor. They ran the pub, and even after Mr Taylor's death, Mrs Taylor went on with the business until she became too old and ill to carry on.



Find a children centre

Go to www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/childrenscentres

To find a particular children centre use the search box and enter the name of the centre in the Keywords field. There is no need to enter the post code.

Each record has contact and location information and an outline of the services. There are links from the records to:

- the centre's Facebook page
- the form to join the centre
- the current timetable directory

Timetable directories

The timetable directory will change according to the school year. We have timetable directories for:

- term-time
- half-term
- the three main holidays Easter, Summer and Christmas

Searching in a timetable directory

You can use the search page to look for:

- the name of any children centre to see what events they are holding
- the name of any session or activity, wherever it is being held

To find the search once you are on a children's centre page, click the previous link (as highlighted) in the black crumb trail at the top of the screen:



To search, enter a word (in this example, sensory room) into the Keywords field and click Search.

You will then see a clickable list of children centres where the word is mentioned.

When you have clicked on a children's centre, to quickly find the same word on the page press Ctrl F and enter the word into the search bar. It will then be highlighted on the page.

The Saturday timetable is the same for all children centres. Families may decide to visit another location at weekends, so all sessions are shown without needing to search.

How to print

To print a timetable, use your browser. Please be aware that printed timetables can soon become out of date as the directory may be updated at any time.

Look in the top right corner of your screen:

- for Microsoft Edge users select
 - for Google Chrome users select

You should then see the option to Print.

How to translate

Scroll to the bottom of any page and select 'Translation'. You will then go to a page where you can select the language. Once you have chosen the language you will be on the county council home page. Do not use the search bar as that will cancel the translation. To see the directories, scroll down and select 'Childcare and family support', then the second yellow button, 'find a children's centre'.

Everything will be in the chosen language as you navigate until you cancel or use the search.

The Normal Minimum Pension Age (NMPA) is the earliest age most people can start withdrawing money from their **personal** and **workplace** pensions. It is currently **55 years old** but is due to increase to <u>57 from the 6th of April 2028</u>, unless you have a *Protected Pension Age* or you're retiring due to ill health.

It is not to be confused with the State Pension Age which is much later (<u>even for the French!</u>) - although increases do tend to correlate with one another.

This isn't the first time the goal posts have been moved, and some of you may remember that the NMPA before April 2010 was age 50. The gradual increase is the result of people tending to live longer and therefore spending a larger proportion of their life in retirement than in the past.

The intended change imposed by the Government looks to support their 'fuller working lives' agenda and aims to mitigate the risk of the premature depletion of pension savings (*we can help with this*) whilst indirectly benefitting the economy through increased labour market participation.

I know you are asking; 'will this affect me?' and rightly so. Look at the below table to establish whether it has any bearing on how soon you can access your pension:

Born before the 6 th of April 1971	Born between the 6 th of April 1971 and the 5 th of April 1973	Born on or after the 6 th of April 1973
You won't be affected by the NMPA change as you'll already be 57 by the 6 th of April 2028.	Given you will be 55 be- fore the 6 th of April 2028 you'll be able to take your pension benefits at any time from your 55 th birthday up to the 6 th of April 2028.	You'll have to wait until you're 57 to take your pension, unless you have a pension with a lower Protected Pension Age.

It is also worth noting that the increase to age 57 will not apply to members of the Uniformed Services Pension Schemes.
