New Councillors

Following the resignation of Cllr Mitchell, we now have vacancies for four more Councillors. Full details of the co-option process are detailed on our website. You could make the difference.

Cemetery Procedures

Following the recent review, we are taking the opportunity to publish the latest cemetery regulations and these are detailed on pages 4 & 5 of this newsletter.

During the review, the Council has become aware of the large number of plots in the Walcott Road Cemetery that have been reserved for future Burials and Ashes interment. The review has shown several instances of relatives being unaware of the reservation and the plot has not been used. Would those residents who have reserved plots ensure that the relevant family members and friends are aware. Should anyone require details of reserved Plot Numbers, please contact the Parish Office for details.

Citizens Advice Bureau

The Council recently gave a donation to the CAB whose workload has increased during the recent pandemic and economic difficulties. It is hoped that the CAB will attend a meeting open to the public to explain how they can help.

Council Tax

Residents will have been pleased to note that the portion of their Council Tax relating to the Parish Council was reduced.

Speed Indicator Device (SID)

Both devices have been brought back into use and it is the Council's intention to publish the statistics as and when these have been analysed. The latest ones that are available are shown on page 14 of this Newsletter.

Dog Fouling

Our street cleaner reports on the number of instances where she clears dog poo on her rounds. Whilst overall numbers appear to have levelled of, she is still finding large quantities of bagged dog poo that has just been left in a heap rathe than being placed in a litter or dog poo bin. Hopefully this practice will be eradicated in the coming months.

Litter Collection

As requested by several residents, we are publishing the bin collection details for Billinghay residents. We are led to believe that in some outlying areas of the village, there may be slight differences but these will be the same as in previous years.


Walcott Road Cemetery Billinghay



Information on Regulations, Terms & Charges

Billinghay Parish Council has overall responsibility for the management and maintenance of the Walcott Road Cemetery in Billinghay. We want the area to be safe, pleasant and welcoming for each of our visitors. Above all, we hope that the families of the bereaved are made to feel welcome and are comforted at one of the most difficult times of their lives.







Current regulations and terms for Walcott Road Cemetery:

The full terms and conditions for the Cemetery are contained in the Billinghay Parish Council Cemetery Policy (PCD015). The policy contains regulations relating to:

Headstones and Plinths
Borders
Displays
Wreaths
Growing plants
Demarcation
Ornaments
Memorial tablets
Placing of pots
Memorial benches

These restrictions have been agreed in order to enable the maintenance team to keep the cemetery and grounds safe and in good order. Please read and adhere to these terms to avoid any upset in the future.

Burial Ground Charges.

The Cemetery Policy also details the full list of charges for use of the Cemetery. Different charges apply to residents and non-residents of Billinghay.

We understand that family members may want to be interred next to their loved ones. Provision is made for this by allowing the reservation of a plot, known as the purchase of Exclusive Rights of Burial. Full terms and charges are contained in the Cemetery Policy.

DOG FOULING

Unfortunately, these pictures represent sights still regularly found on footpaths and off-road areas around Billinghay. Whilst a large number of dog owners are responsible and dispose of dog waste correctly, there is a minority that do not.





Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £100. If the case goes to court this could cost the owner or person in charge of the animal up to £1,000.

The law states that being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse. If someone does fail to clean up after their pet in the village, it falls to the Parish Council to get rid of it. This cost ultimately comes out of your Council Tax.

Some might argue that putting the dog poo into a bag and then hanging the bag from a tree or dumping the bag on the ground is OK. This is not the case. If there is not a bin nearby then please take the bag home and dispose of responsibly.



Dog fouling is not only deeply unpleasant, but also dangerous. Whilst rare, contact with dog waste can cause toxocariasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizures.


Penny, the council litter picker, does a sterling job in clearing the dog waste from our public areas. Without her efforts we would all be subject to a lot more dog waste than we currently are.

Throughout the village there are located 16 litter bins which can be used for the disposal of both litter and dog waste (but in poo bags please). In addition, there are 8 dedicated dog waste bins. The eighth bin has recently been installed in Mill Lane at the junction of the footpath leading to Park Lane. This is to address a growing issue with dog waste in the fields off Mill Lane, alongside the 2 public footpaths to Park Lane and the playing field.

SPEED INDICATOR DEVICES

Both devices have been in operation. This article covers the statistics for the period 26th September 2023 to 6th December 2023, when both SIDs were set to face traffic approaching from Walcott. Both SIDs were switched off over the period 7th December 2023 to 6th February 2024. This is in line with operating practices as a device constantly on becomes part of the furniture; think of that health and safety poster on the notice board that has been there months that nobody takes any notice of. For the period 7th February 2024 to 5th April 2024 both SIDs were again set facing traffic approaching from Walcott.

Unsurprisingly, the Field Road SIDs shows quite clearly the disregard of the 30 mph speed limit past Tower View Close and Church Fields Close by almost 50% of drivers when leaving the village. The siting of the Police Mobile Speed Vehicle and random police speed checks have led to action being taken against drivers but this does not appear to be a deterrent. However, on entering the village the statistics are slightly more encouraging.

With a substantial amount of data now available it will be possible to get a greater interpretation of the data, such as times of day break downs etc. More to follow. As before, the maximum speed recorded has not been published as we do not want to encourage anyone to think this is a target to be beaten.



FIX MY STREET



Fed up with problems such as potholes, broken paving slabs, street lighting and overgrown hedges?

If everyone who is affected also reported the problem direct to Lincolnshire County Council, the seriousness of the problem would be emphasised. The identity of the person reporting the problem can remain anonymous unless they choose to show their name.

Residents without computer access can still report problems via the Parish Council who will pass on details to Lincolnshire County Council. We will continue to do this but we can only register the complaint once. Numerous residents reporting the same problem will have a greater impact on prioritising problems.

Therefore, we would recommend that you use the system provided by the County Council and report the problems directly to them using the **Fix My Street system on the LCC website.**

A WALK THROUGH THE PAST IN BILLINGHAY (Continued from the last issue)

The Ship seems to have been the meeting place for numerous village eccentrics (some would say that it still is!). There was a silver cup called the "Royal George" with a half-gallon capacity and several customers could drain it with ease.

Loll Creasey, who was an ex-professional boxer who fought all over the country for six years until the Second World War broke out, used to perform great feats of strength lifting a 56lb weight with each little finger for the amusement of his fellow drinkers.

Sukey Flash was a retired tailor, a tall, thin man, whose years of sitting cross-legged as he stitched had given him unusually mobile joints. For a pint of beer, he would demonstrate his ability to balance the pint glass on his upturned sole and lift it to his mouth to drink. He could also weave through the gap below the seat of a chair, slithering in and out of the tiny spaces between the cross pieces on the chair legs and the seat itself.

But Bubbling Jack Smith was perhaps one of the most remarkable eccentrics to grace The Ship. He was a fearsome character who struck terror into the hearts of the local children. He used to aggravate the already-inflamed Saturday night fighters by circling around the back of the locked rowdies and kicking the backs of their knees. Probably his most notable achievement, however, was his rat-catching. He used to release a large and unsavoury rat from a sack and pursue it on hands and knees, like a dog, among the chair and table legs until he had got it cornered. His astonishing tour de force was then to bite out the rat's throat with his teeth, upon which he collected free drinks from the astonished onlookers.

Opposite the Ship. On the corner of Queen Street and High Street is a private house, which was once The Old Lord Nelson Pub. As a child Edwards Willows (1854 – 1938), the son of John Locking Willows, who owned Willows General Store in Queen Street, saw a drunken scuffle outside the pub end in a fatal stabbing.

After witnessing the murder, he vowed then and there that when he was a man he would buy the pub and close it down. Unlike most pious childhood resolutions, Edward Willows, grew up and kept his promise. (the picture overleaf shows the Old Lord Nelson Pub opposite the Ship Inn)

Number 5 Queen Street was once a tailor's. The frontage and windows have remained very much as they were, and it was here, in full view through the window, that Mr F Hollins a ladies and gents Tailor used to sit in the 1930s. He was perched, cross-legged, on a high table which kept

the material off the floor and free from dust or grime, stitching breeches and the suits which he sold for thirty shillings apiece. Shirts were also available at 5s 11d each and gloves at 1s 11d.

Facing the old tailors is the site where Wilson's Taxi Business used to be



run with the old petrol pump still visible in the yard. The garage was built in 1947/8.

Walter Wilson also used to use a car and trailer to transport pigs to the local markets in Boston and Lincoln. In addition he ferried the children to school from the outlying areas like Tattershall Bridge as well as delivering hot dinners to the school.

On the opposite side of the street was a block which stretched to the corner of Queen Street and Bridge Street and this was Willows General Store which operated until the early 1940s. It sold sugar, flour, rice and tapioca weighed out to each customer's specific requirements from large sacks standing on the floor. Customers took their own jars and were sold dark treacle from a barrel and vinegar was sold in the same way. Willows was a magnet for the children who saved up their pennies for "locusts" (sweet dried carob beans) at a halfpenny a time and boiled sweets at 1d or 2d a quarter.

Part of the building was a bakery where bread, buns and plum bread were produced and local children also enjoyed watching over the split door as the bread was taken from the oven, bread which, still warm, was taken round Billinghay in baskets by roundsmen.



The Saturday timetable is the same for all children centres. Families may decide to visit another location at weekends, so all sessions are shown without needing to search.

How to print

To print a timetable, use your browser. Please be aware that printed timetables can soon become out of date as the directory may be updated at any time.

Look in the top right corner of your screen:

- for Microsoft Edge users select
 - for Google Chrome users select

You should then see the option to Print.

How to translate

Scroll to the bottom of any page and select 'Translation'. You will then go to a page where you can select the language. Once you have chosen the language you will be on the county council home

Do not use the search bar as that will cancel the translation. To see the directories, scroll down and select 'Childcare and family support', then the second yellow button, 'Find a children's centre'.

Everything will be in the chosen language as you navigate until you cancel or use the search.


