# **GRANT APPLICATIONS**

Billinghay Parish Council has a small budget for the award of grants to local Organisations. The amount budgeted sets the limit for the total of any awards. If there are successful applications which exceed the total amount, awards may be given proportionately.

The Council can only award grants in accordance with its legal powers. Any application received must clearly show benefit to some or all of the parish residents or some or all of the parish area. In addition, the benefit obtained must be commensurate with the expenditure incurred.

Grants will be considered at the Parish Council Finance meeting on the **18th November 2024** and every grant must meet the Council's grant criteria. More details regarding this are shown on the Application Form.

The Grant request must be submitted on the Billinghay Parish Council Application for Small Grants Form. Copies of the application form can be requested from the Parish Council Office or downloaded from the Billinghay Parish Council website (Policy and Procedures Section).

All applications must be accompanied by appropriate accounts and or supporting financial information (such as estimates for equipment or work to be undertaken).

Forms and the supporting information must be returned to the Parish Office by the 30th September 2024 so that Councillors have sufficient time to consider each application.

If a face-to-face discussion is preferrable then the Parish Office, located at Ringmoor House, is open:

9:15am to 12:30pm Monday, Tuesday and Thursday.

The Council has a website at <a href="https://billinghay.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk/">https://billinghay.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk/</a> which contains a lot of information relating to council activity, including minutes of all council meetings and the policies under which the Council operates.

The Council normally holds its meetings on the first Monday of each month, although this may vary sometimes due to councillor availability, bank holidays etc. The proposed meeting dates are published on the Council website. They are normally held in the room to the rear of Billinghay Methodist Chapel, Victoria Street. The agendas detailing

what will be discussed, time of meeting and location are placed on parish noticeboards and on the website prior to the meeting.

Members of the public are able to attend these meetings, however input from members of the public is restricted to a short session at the start of the meeting. The Council may not be able to respond immediately to issues raised at the meeting if further investigation is required.

It would be nice to hear about what is working well in the Parish as well as what is not so good.

#### THE ROLE OF PARISH COUNCILLORS

The parish councillor's primary role is to represent the Billinghay area and the people who live in it. Councillors provide a bridge between the community and the council. As well as being an advocate for Billinghay residents and signposting them to the right people either at the North Kesteven District Council, Lincolnshire County Council or other agencies, they should ensure that the community is informed about the issues that affect them.

Parish councillors are expected to:

Respond to residents' queries and investigate their concerns (casework).

Communicate council decisions that affect the community.

Know their area and be aware of any problems.

Know and work with representatives of local organisations, interest groups and businesses.

Represent their community's views at council meetings.

If you feel you could contribute your time and effort as a parish councillor then please contact either the Chair or the Clerk in the first instance.

## **Fix My Street**

Fix My Street is an application to report, view, or discuss local problems, such as potholes, broken paving slabs, street lighting, overgrown hedges or flooding. It can be accessed by going to <a href="https://fixmystreet.lincolnshire.gov.uk/">https://fixmystreet.lincolnshire.gov.uk/</a> or the app can be downloaded onto your mobile phone. The app has the advantage that it can be used to report an issue at the actual location of the issue.

We encourage residents to use this app rather than wait to report it at a council meeting or to the clerk. This is because the Council have to report these issues on Fix My Street once reported to them and this could potentially delay the reporting, and subsequent resolution, of an issue. If reported by a resident then they will receive updates as to the progression of the issue directly.

Thank you to the Billinghay Fire crew who visited school to help finish the Year 1 Magpie Classes Great Fire of London topic.



# **CEMETERY NOTICE**

The headstone pictured below is in a poor state of repair and is continuing to break down. The Council are worried about possible damage to equipment caused by the crumbling stone.



The grave is in the north west corner of the Billinghay Cemetery and is in plot number 417. (see overall map below)

It is believed the grave is that of Elizabeth and Robert Couling. Elizabeth was buried on 13 November 1945 and Robert on 12 February 1955.

The Council need to take action to remove the remaining part of the headstone to prevent any problems. Consequently, unless advised of alternative repair / replacement options by any living relatives, they will remove the headstone at the end of September.

# SPEED INDICATOR DEVICES

The council continues to alter the direction of the cameras and the length of time in one direction, as well as being 'switched off' to see the effect this has on traffic speed monitoring. This article covers the statistics for the period 4<sup>th</sup> April 2024 to 27<sup>th</sup> July 2024 with both cameras facing the traffic heading in Walcott direction for the duration of this period. Both cameras were operational for the whole duration.

# **ARCHER SURVEY**

Following concerns raised about the speed of vehicles along Mill Lane, the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership (LRSP) took vehicle speed measurements at the junction of Cornfield Road over a seven day period from 29<sup>th</sup> May 2024.

Analysis of the speed data showed that the average speed of vehicles was 35.1 mph in a 30-mph limit. The speed data showed evidence that some vehicles were exceeding the speed limit at a speed that would make the drivers liable to action or prosecution by the Police.

Research of collisions involving personal injury for the last 3-year period up to a date of 30<sup>th</sup> April 2024 showed there have been no recorded collisions.

Highways engineers within the LRSP have assessed the area and concluded that no engineering casualty reduction measures were identified.

The only form of speed enforcement that the LRSP can carry out is with the use of speed cameras. The criterion includes locations where there is a history of speed related injury collisions supported by evidence of a high degree of non-compliance with the speed limit. The results of the survey together with an analysis of the collision data show that the criteria required for either fixed or mobile speed camera enforcement is not met.

Speed cameras are only one part of Lincolnshire Police Speed Enforcement Strategy and the details of the surveys have been shared with Lincolnshire Police for them to undertake enforcement when resourcing allows of which we have no control over.



# **FIX MY STREET**



# Fed up with problems such as potholes, broken paving slabs, street lighting and overgrown hedges?

If everyone who is affected also reported the problem direct to Lincolnshire County Council, the seriousness of the problem would be emphasised. The identity of the person reporting the problem can remain anonymous unless they choose to show their name.

Residents without computer access can still report problems via the Parish Council who will pass on details to Lincolnshire County Council. We will continue to do this but we can only register the complaint once. Numerous residents reporting the same problem will have a greater impact on prioritising problems.



# **BILLINGHAY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN**

In 2015, Billinghay Parish Council produced a Neighbourhood Plan for the village.

This was a ten-year plan with the following objective:

To enable sustainable growth and development, preserve and enhance the quality of life for the community, and safeguard and protect environmental quality, including special historical characteristics of the neighbourhood.

The Plan which was eventually produced (Copies may be viewed at the Parish Office)) was adopted following a referendum and contains lots of "guidelines" particularly on aspects of Planning, North Kesteven District Council Planning have to take all the relevant aspects into account when considering Planning Applications.

The ten-year period is close to expiring and now is the time for the Plan to be reviewed to ensure that it is still relevant and meets the needs of the village.

Whilst the Plan was produced ostensibly by the Parish Council, the work was carried out by a separate Project Management Arrangement through the Neighbourhood Plan working group. Whilst the group did contain Councillors, it also incorporated residents who:

- Wished to help in the development and ensure their views were listened to.
- Had special interest in Business and the impact the Plan may have on commercial activities.
- Wanted to ensure any development was in line with the village requirements.

The review of the Plan will need similar residents to form a working group and become part of a Parish Council sub-committee to achieve this.

Consequently, the Parish Council are looking for volunteers who wish to contribute to this renewal process to come forward.

If you are interested in the development of the village and feel you can contribute, please contact the Parish Office so that a work group can be formed, and the update of the Plan can proceed.



THEY WERE INSTALLED BY THE LOCAL COUNCIL AS PART OF A REGENERATION PROJECT FOR THE MARKET PLACE. EACH ZOETROPE IS ACCOMPANIED BY A "FINGER" SIGN MANUFACTURED BY THE LOCAL BLACKSMITH.

#### THE SCENES REPRESENTED ARE:

- MR MAPLETHORPE, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS SUKY FLASH, A LOCAL TAILOR WITH AN UNUSUAL PARTY TRICK. HE WAS SO DOUBLE JOINTED THAT HE COULD LIFT A BEER GLASS BALANCED ON HIS FOOT, SLIDE BETWEEN THE LEGS OF A CHAIR AND RETURN TO HIS SEAT.
- FRED GILBERT WAS APIANO TEACHER WHO RODE ROUND THE VILLAGE ON AN OLD FASHIONED BICYCLE. HE WAS SO SHORTSIGHTED, HE WORE UP TO THREE PAIRS OF SPECS ON HIS NOSE AT THE SAME TIME. LESSONS WERE SPENT LOOKING FOR LOST PAIRS!

- A ONE FINGER SIGN TELLING OF BILLINGHAY BOYS WHO USED TO RIDE ROUND ON THE SAILS OF THE FORMER POST MILL IN KYME ROAD. IT WAS AN IDEAL FAIRGROUND RIDE FOR THEM. THE BOYS USED TO WAIT FOR A SAIL TO SWING ROUND, JUMP ON IT AND RIDE THE WHOLE CIRCUIT WHILE CLINGING ON FOR DEAR LIFE. (HEALTH & SAFETY EAT YOUR HEART OUT!)

# 5 KEY THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT ANNUITIES WHEN CREATING YOUR RETIREMENT INCOME

Are you concerned about whether you can afford to retire, or afford the lifestyle you want in retirement. For many people, the state pension is not enough, and they need additional retirement income to support travel, spoiling the grandchildren, or staying in the home they love. Saving enough money can be a challenge, especially if costs of living are rising.

Annuities are one way to help you create solid, sufficient income in retirement, but you need to understand some key things about them in order to leverage them properly and make sure you can sustain your lifestyle in retirement.

So, here are four things you should know:

#### **PURCHASED LIFE ANNUITIES VS. PENSION ANNUITIES**

If you have one of these annuities, you need to know the difference for tax purposes.

Purchased life annuities are an *insurance* product. You pay a lump sum and then get an annual payment for life, or for a fixed period. Typically your heirs will get any remaining money when you die (assuming it's within any fixed period). This is basically an investment vehicle, and any income is taxed as investment income. Purchased annuities do *not* have to be bought with pension money.

Pension annuities are considered pensions and are taxed as pension income. The first 25% is tax-free. You have to spend money from your pension pot on these, making purchased annuities the better choice if you don't have a good pot already. If you do, however, pension annuities tend to give a better return.

You should talk to a tax advisor about which option is likely to be most beneficial to you.

#### **FIXED VERSUS INCREASING ANNUITIES**

Once set up, an annuity cannot (usually) be altered, but there are <u>options</u> prior to that decision being made. If you select a fixed term annuity, it will pay out on the terms agreed at outset for a fixed period of time. At the end of the term there could be a maturity amount, which is also set up at outset. These can be used to fill an income gap before State Pension Age. All other annuities are paid out for the life of the policyholder and the terms can differ.

There are basically four types of payment:

- 1. Level. With a level annuity you will get the same income each year, typically at a higher starting amount. However, they don't take into account inflation or incrases in your cost of living due to mobility issues or failing health.
- 2. Escalating. Escalating annuities start lower, but increase at a fixed rate each year, such as 3%. This provides some allowance for inflation, but may not be enough of a cushion during volatile periods.
- 3. Inflation-linked. These start at a low level, but rise each year in line with the retail price index. Inflation-linked annuities are better for people who expect to live longer and get a benefit over an extended period of time.
- 4. Impaired or enhanced. With this type of annuity they pay out more if you have health issues that may shorten your lifespan, such as diabetes or high blood pressure. The income rates are often considerably better, but they work on the assump-

tion you won't be around long.

For most people, an escalating annuity is the best option, however, the starting income is significantly lower. You should talk to an expert about which is really best for you.

#### PROTECTING YOUR SPOUSE

You may want to ensure that your spouse continues to get the money after your death, especially if they are younger or healthier than you. A joint life annuity often provides lower income but that income will continue through the life of the surviving spouse.

#### LIFETIME VERSUS FIXED TERM

A lifetime annuity lasts until you die. You can't <u>cancel a lifetime annuity</u>. You have essentially spent that money in order to get it back later, and if you find that it is not increasing enough to cover your costs, you will have to seek other ways to increase your income.

There's also the risk that you might get less back than you paid if you die earlier than expected, and only some annuities give the remaining money back to your estate. A lifetime annuity thus might not be the best choice if you are in poor health. However, you don't have to do any reinvestment and if you are healthy, you can get substantially more money than you paid in.

A fixed-term annuity, on the other hand, lasts a set number of years. The max is 40 years, but most fixed-term annuities are 5 to 10 years. The money you pay in is invested, and you get not just the regular income but a lump sum at the end that includes the interest. You can then use it to buy another annuity, do a pension drawdown, or make a large purchase. Fixed-term annuities mean you can benefit from improved terms in the future and give you more flexibility, but may not be as stable as a lifetime annuity.

Note that you can potentially have both! You can put part of your pension in a lifetime annuity to pay certain bills, and part of it in a fixed-term annuity.


