# A CELEBRATION OF THE LIFE AND WORKS OF BERNARD GILBERT BILLINGHAY'S FAMOUS AUTHOR

The Parish Council and Billinghay History Group in conjunction with Bishop Grosseteste University are in the process of setting up an event celebrating the life of Bernard Gilbert the famous author and war poet who came from Billinghay.

Most people in the village will know of his book "John of the Fens" based around the Civil War with specific reference to this area. His reputation as a war poet (1914/18) and his fictional 'Old England' series written in the 1920s are not so well known.

Professor Andrew Jackson from the University is author of book about Bernard Gilbert's life and he will be giving a presentation during the evening showing how the author used his knowledge of the local area and incorporated this information into his books. The book will be on sale at the evening talk.

The day will include three walks as part of the North Kesteven Walking Festival (link to the Festival here <a href="https://www.hillholtwood.co.uk/nk-walking-festival">https://www.hillholtwood.co.uk/nk-walking-festival</a>) taking in locations featured in Gilbert's writing. Readings from Gilbert's poetry and writing will be read during the walks.

# **Current Plan of Events for the day.**

Currently plans are being formalised for a full day of Events. Each of the events are "stand-alone" and people will be allowed to attend all or select any of these that they wish to attend.

At present, the provisional timetable for the day is as below but the final details will be given in the next Newsletter.

- **9.30 am to 11.30 am** a walk round Walcott and Catley Abbey followed by coffee at Walcott church at 11.30 am
- **2.00 pm 3.30 pm** a short walk from Tattershall Bridge, taking in a view of Tattershall Castle (for John of the Fens reference).
- 5.00 pm to 6.30pm a walk round Billinghay Village

The intention of the walks will be to highlight the places that Bernard Gilbert used in his works although he may have changed their real names for literary purposes.

**6.30 pm – Arrival for talk** – Light refreshments provided – Church Community Rooms – there will be an exhibition of books etc. relating to Bernard Gilbert.

# 7.00pm Start of Talk

Title of Talk: Searching for 'Gilbert Country': The Lincolnshire of Billinghay's Bernard Samuel Gilbert, author, 1882-1927.

Talk by Professor Andrew J H Jackson of Bishop Grosseteste University.

# 8.15 pm Exercise to look at maps and places in Gilbert's writing

Andrew Jackson and Nicola Marshall (Event Organiser) will bring maps, books and other documents of interest.

It is hoped that local residents will be able to identify some of the real names for the fictional ones used in the author's books.

# **BILLINGHAY MEDICAL PRACTICE**

Billinghay Medical Practice has begun hosting drop-in sessions for support groups and local charities in the main reception area. 'One You Lincolnshire' is a programme consisting of help with stopping smoking, weight loss, exercise and drinking less.

They will be attending every three months, with other organisations such as Age Concern (who said it was the best group they had attended recently) and other interactive groups will follow on three monthly.

The practice is a Veteran Friendly practice, and as the local RBL branch has supported with some funding, we are able to hold a monthly Clinic, with 30-minute appointments. A Veteran Nurse Practitioner herself will be running them. Dates are posted on Facebooks Billinghay Medical Practice page, on the practice website and in the surgery waiting room. All known veterans have been contacted.

Billinghay is possibly the only practice in the UK to hold these clinics so far.

**Veterans Clinic**. The Billinghay Branch are very proud to have enabled funding for five years for the newly established Veterans Clinic run by the Billinghay Medical Practice. The project has already identified a significant number of veterans in the area who were not previously registered as such, enabling greater support to those individuals under the Armed Forces Covenant. The first clinic was run on 20<sup>th</sup> January 2025 and was fully booked.

**RBL Support**. ### **BILLINGHAY FOOTPATHS**

As residents know several inspections/surveys have been made of the state of the village footpaths in the last few years.

We are delighted to advise you that the Surface Treatments Team from Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) have announced the paths designated for Footpath Micro-Surfacing in 2025 to 2026.

Actual programme dates have yet to be confirmed but, as this type of work is seasonal, it will take place between April and September. Actual dates will be confirmed nearer the time and residents affected by the work will be advised in advance.

In preparation for the micro surfacing, patching work will be undertaken to remove any structural defects in advance of the resurfacing and so some initial activity is likely between March and May time.

LCC have also pointed out that micro surfacing can seem aggressive when first laid and can initially encourage weeds during the germination process. They will be conducting regular inspections with pre and post weed sprays so please bear this in mind before making any complaints.

The Parish Council are delighted that the work is finally going to be done and hope that the work will alleviate current complaints about the state of the footpaths. Please bear in mind that there will be some disruption which will be unavoidable.

The undernoted paths have been identified for the works:

- FIELD ROAD
- MEADOW WAY
- MILL LANE
- BRUNSWICK SQUARE
- THE WHYCHE
- LAFFORD DRIVE

In addition we have been advised of the following improvements that are being implemented in the next year (2025/26):

FEN ROAD Footway reconstruction
 LAFFORD DRIVE Carriageway Micro Asphalt
 HIGH STREET Carriageway Surface Dressing

The Parish Council are already aware of difficulties faced by the users of Mobility Scooters and Wheelchairs when trying to negotiate the footpaths of the village safely. We would ask that any resident, experiencing such difficulties, advise the Parish Council to ensure that the matter can be investigated.





FixMyStreet is not a council website but it does send your reports directly to your local council, or whichever other authority is responsible for dealing with a problem. You can submit reports anonymously, but if you provide your details then updates regarding your report will be provided. Providing your details on the site does not make them visible to other users against submitted reports, unless you choose to.

Reports are also published online, so that others in the community can see what's already been reported and subscribe to any reports they're interested in. Your issue may have already been reported, and there is a facility to update existing reports


The application is really easy to use. All you have to do is type in a UK postcode – or let the site locate you automatically – and describe your problem. A picture truly does speak a thousand words so attaching photos of the issue could help to resolve the issue sooner. Then your report will be sent to the people whose job it is to fix it.

The categories under which a report can be submitted are:

Bollards, Bridges, Structures and Safety Barriers, Bus stops and shelters, Drains, Flooding – highway, Flooding - home or business, Graffiti, Grass, Grit Bins, Litter, Nuisance parking, Pavement and verge, Potholes, Public Rights of Way, Road Markings, Roads and cycleways, Roadworks, Signs, Street furniture, Street lighting, Street nameplates, Traffic signals, Trees, Weeds.



### PRIORITIES AND ACTION TAKEN

# **Priority:**

Summertime Anti-social behaviour – policing the hotspots across the area where we typically see a surge in nuisance behaviour and disorder.

### **Action Taken:**

Since the start of September, we have been able to have more officers spending time in areas which are negatively affected by the behaviour of others. So far this has been very well received, with lots of positive endorsements from residents, shoppers and retailers who are regularly telling us how nice it is to "see a bobby out on the beat". Our extra patrols will continue through the winter months.

# **Priority:**

Community Drug Supply – Disrupting the supply of Class A Drugs in Sleaford, minimising the violence linked to drug supply, Reducing the demand for Class A drugs by offering support for addiction.

### **Action Taken:**

During the first week in October, local officers were part of a large-scale operation to tackle suspected County Lines drug operations. Over the course of two days in the Sleaford area, eight people were arrested, three warrants were carried out, three children were safeguarded, and weapons, cash and drugs were seized.

Neighbourhood Policing officers were supported by British Transport Police's (BTP) County Lines Taskforce, and the Metropolitan Police's Op Orochi County Lines task force.

In the same week, a county lines drug trafficker who ran a drugs line that supplied cocaine and heroin into Sleaford was convicted at Lincoln Crown Court. Kieran Staff, 40 of no fixed address, was sentenced to three years in prison after an investigation led by Lincolnshire Police and supported by the Metropolitan Police's Op Orochi county lines task force.

Latest Priority (No update on Action Taken available)

Youth ASB across Sleaford's rural villages – During the darker autumn months we will ensure our patrols focus on low-level nuisance, disorder and damage that can be linked to local young people. Working with parents, schools and partners to begin with early warning visits about responsibility and looking at available diversionary activities.






