- Our School Summer Gala.



BILLINGHAY MEDICAL PRACTICE

Billinghay Medical Practice has begun hosting drop-in sessions for support groups and local charities in the main reception area. 'One You Lincolnshire' is a programme consisting of help with stopping smoking, weight loss, exercise and drinking less.

They will be attending every three months, with other organisations such as Age Concern (who said it was the best group they had attended recently) and other interactive groups will follow on three monthly.

The practice is a Veteran Friendly practice, and as the local RBL branch has supported with some funding, we are able to hold a monthly Clinic, with 30-minute appointments. A Veteran Nurse Practitioner herself will be running them. Dates are posted on Facebooks Billinghay Medical Practice page, on the practice website and in the surgery waiting room. All known veterans have been contacted.

Billinghay is possibly the only practice in the UK to hold these clinics so far.




VE DAY 80th 8th MAY 2025

buffet. We are also very grateful to North Kesteven District Council for the grant which allowed us to fund the celebrations.



PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY - BILLINGHAY

The Parish Council have received several complaints about the use of the Public Rights of Way within the village.

These generally fall into the categories below:

- People using the paths but not keeping to the designated footway and trespassing onto private land with the possibility of causing damage to crops and the like. We would ask all users to ensure that they keep to the actual paths and not take "shortcuts" across cultivated land.
- People riding horses along the footpaths this is only legal on rights of way that are designated bridleways. Riders must ensure that the path they are using is a bridleway.
- The footpaths not being clearly defined and kept in a reasonable state for people to walk along them. These should be reported immediately.

The Parish Council will listen to such complaints and, where felt necessary, make representations to enable remedial action to be taken.

However, the responsibility for the management and enforcement of Public Rights of Way and work with farmers and other landowners to ensure access is not affected, belongs with the Lincolnshire County Council.



FixMyStreet is not a council website but it does send your reports directly to your local council, or whichever other authority is responsible for dealing with a problem. You can submit reports anonymously, but if you provide your details then updates regarding your report will be provided. Providing your details on the site does not make them visible to other users against submitted reports, unless you choose to.



The picture below is the page you will enter following the link above. The app homepage is very similar and asks for the same information



Reports are also published online, so that others in the community can see what's already been reported and subscribe to any reports they're interested in. Your issue may have already been reported, and there is a facility to update existing reports


The application is really easy to use. All you have to do is type in a UK postcode – or let the site locate you automatically – and describe your problem. A picture truly does speak a thousand words so attaching photos of the issue could help to resolve the issue sooner. Then your report will be sent to the people whose job it is to fix it.

The categories under which a report can be submitted are:

Bollards, Bridges, Structures and Safety Barriers, Bus stops and shelters, Drains, Flooding – highway, Flooding - home or business, Graffiti, Grass, Grit Bins, Litter, Nuisance parking, Pavement and verge, Potholes, Public Rights of Way, Road Markings, Roads and cycleways, Roadworks, Signs, Street furniture, Street lighting, Street nameplates, Traffic signals, Trees, Weeds.

Just One Financial Thing - Part 5

We continue with our series of financial tips and start with the experience of a client. He had been offered a great deal to buy a car, if it was taken on finance. With no repayment clauses it made sense to take out the finance with a view to paying it off quickly (perhaps even immediately from cash reserves - that's a tip for another day!) but was turned down. This was someone of a more advanced age, with no mortgage, credit card and debts. He rang me to discuss the alternative options, and the first step was to check his credit score. This is something that most of us do not do.

It transpired that as he had never had any debt, he had no credit score, meaning that the lender had no track record to decide on credit worthiness. This is perhaps a rare instance, but we should all be aware of our credit rating and check it regularly. It could also highlight potential scams, where your address had been used by a third party. So take 5 minutes to register with one of the free services and check your records are correct.

The next tip is something that we all know we should do, but many of us struggle to find the time for - check your renewals. It might be car insurance, building and contents insurance or your mobile phone contract. This applies to your personal contracts but also to your business contracts. It is a competitive market and there are people out there vying for your business.

This means that we have to be on high alert (if it looks too good to be true it probably is) but on the other hand when a policy is due for renewal do not be afraid to try and negotiate. There are some great comparison websites, but again remember that not everyone is on those and some of the great deals can be found by going direct.

And if you don't have time, make use of a broker. They are there to help you find the best deal - not just based on price but on finding the right policy for you - and I am sure that some of my connections might comment on this post so that you can contact them.


BYGONES
